Create opportunities for all New Zealanders to engage with Māori culture

- Identify public need

- Demonstrate an increased connection between the NZ public and Māori culture

Our partnerships

- Create and implement effective mechanisms that work for iwi and Manatū Taonga
- So that Manatū Taonga staff are confident, competent and connected to other partners (iwi and agencies) to deliver a programme of public focused activities
- Iwi/Māori and Manatū Taonga have a shared understanding of each others' cultural priorities, Treaty commitments and obligations
- And are clear around the respective roles of Manatū Taonga, Te Puni Kōkiri, sector and other agencies, and iwi

Support Iwi/Māori cultural priorities

- Dialogue with iwi about their priorities
- Co-create and design initiatives with iwi
- Build coalitions through relationships with partnerships
- Pilot, then roll out or activate mechanisms
- Use learnings to inform opportunities for broader public engagement with Māori culture
