Evaluate (12 April - 30 June 2021)



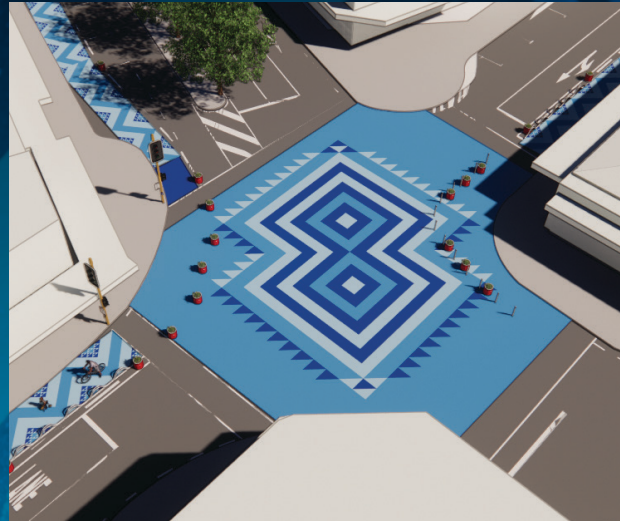
Make changes based on community feedback (12 April - 30 June 2021)

What is the intersection artwork about?



The intersection surface artwork was created by west Auckland artist Jermaine Reihana.

It uses a contemporary interpretation of Tāniko, Whāriki and Tukutuku (weaving patterns), to highlight the significance of Henderson as a place where both people and the Twin Streams (Opanuku and Oratia) come together to meet.

Bringing temporary changes to the central streets of Henderson to trial more vibrant, safer and people-friendly spaces.

From 12 April to 30 June 2021, Henderson town centre will go through a series of exciting trials to be rolled out in stages on Great North Rd, Railside Ave and Ratanui Streets.

These trials are part of the 'Henderson Streets for People' project – led by Panuku Development Auckland and Auckland Transport with the majority funded by Waka Kotahi (NZ Transport Agency) through its Innovating Streets initiative.

The project takes a co-design approach which means working with locals to design quick, temporary improvements to test and trial on our streets to see how well they work. We will be collecting feedback based on the community's experience so we can tweak changes before we assess its long-term future.



SHARED PATHS –

making it safe to ride, walk, scooter and connecting to the twin stream paths network



ON STREET ARTWORK –

brings colour, vibrancy and mana whenua storytelling into the town centre



RE-ROUTING TRAFFIC –

reducing traffic in the town centre making it safer for people



Traffic Flow map

The changes are proposed on a number of streets in Central Henderson (see map above):

- A **trial traffic flow plan** - where most traffic will be directed around the Henderson 'ring road' on Alderman Drive
- A large **artwork** at the intersection of Great North Road, Railside Ave and Ratanui Street.
- A **trial zebra crossing** on Great North Road to give pedestrians priority (this is an upgrade to an existing crossing point)
- A trial of **safe shared paths** to connect people walking, cycling and scooting from the twin streams

paths into the centre of Henderson. The artwork for the shared path was chosen by the community and will include planters and buffers to provide protection from traffic.

- A **trial of bus lanes** leading into and out of the Henderson bus interchange on Railside Ave.
