In August 2019, after one of this individual's letters were published online, Corrections' then-Chief Executive Christine Stevenson [released](#) some limited information regarding this individual's mail, we now consider that public interest in the secure management of the individual's mail has been met. This is through establishing revised and robust processes for the management of his mail (including the final decision to withhold his mail being made by the Chief Executive), alongside Corrections accepting the recommendations of the independent review of prisoner mail and making wider changes to the mail system.

Please note that this response may be published on Corrections' website. Typically, responses are published quarterly, or as otherwise determined. Your personal information including name and contact details will be removed for publication.
