

Acute Respiratory Infection Bed Placement

Screen the child and parent /caregiver bubble daily AND with onset of any new respiratory symptoms using the Acute Respiratory Infection Screening Tool (DD3400) and keep in the patient's clinical record **Patient** Screened **Green Stream Red Stream Orange B Stream Orange Stream** Ward 25 or 26B only Home based ward General paediatric pts with no respiratory symptoms – level 4 **AIIR** Single room Single room Pts with medical complexity or fragility and no Negative pressure Room (Door closed) (Door closed) respiratory symptoms -26A Cohorted room with curtains drawn if no single room available Usual room placement Contact and Contact and Airborne precautions Standard precautions Airborne precautions (or other required transmissible infection precautions) De-escalation of precautions according to Criteria for De-escalation on reverse of screening tool by designated senior RN (in consultation with Paediatric Infectious disease team if needed) as soon as swab result available.
