Official Information Act Request - OIA 14116 Number of People With Heart Related Issues

On 28 January 2022, under section 12 of the Official Information Act, you requested the following information from Whanganui District Health Board (WDHB):

I am seeking the number of people that have visited any/all hospitals and doctor's surgeries within the WDHB for any/all heart related issues, (including but not limited to pericarditis, myocarditis, heart attacks and strokes). The data requested is for the 11 month period from February 2021 until December 2021 inclusive, displayed in month by month format, and compared to the monthly data for the previous three years.

Whanganui District Health Boards response:

I am seeking the number of people that have visited any/all hospitals and doctor's surgeries within the WDHB for any/all heart related issues, (including but not limited to pericarditis, myocarditis, heart attacks and strokes). The data requested is for the 11 month period from February 2021 until December 2021 inclusive, displayed in month by month format, and compared to the monthly data for the previous three years.

The data in the table below includes all events in the specified timeframe, plus events in the preceding three years, by month. Both the number of patients (unique people) and the number of contacts (simple volumes) have both been included.

The data includes all inpatient and ED attendances which are coded with an ICD10 code which represents a circulatory condition. The definition is quite broad, including (but not limited to) heart disease, strokes, hypertension, myocardial infarctions, angina, etc. Given that patients can be admitted from ED into the general hospital and both represent separate events in the DHB system, these events may be counted twice in the Contacts column.

The volumes also include outpatient attendances for specific cardiac related clinics (such as cardiac rehab and cardiology testing). Outpatient event diagnoses are far less structured; therefore, the clinic was used as a proxy.

Data requested around general practice visits is not available to the DHB; however, we are relatively confident that this data is not collected with any accuracy in general practice, and they are unlikely to be able to respond.

Data in February 2018 is incomplete due to a patient management system change, but all other months are complete.
