

The purpose of consultation with external agencies on the draft policy is to seek their agreement on specific sections of the policy which may involve their agencies – e.g. seeking their input into human rights information to be provided to the Minister; and setting out guidance on wider notification of breaches identified by GCSB and NZSIS – and their awareness, as a number of these agencies are developing their own human rights policies at present.

GCSB and NZSIS can consult with the OIGIS at the same time as these external agencies, noting the policy will be in draft and may be subject to change.

Many thanks for the update. It is good to hear that the redraft of the JPS HRRM is underway.

We would like to request that the NZSIS and GCSB provide the draft policy to the IGIS for his comments at the same time as you consult other external agencies (which will hopefully be, as you note, before the end of February). It seems to us that the IGIS' contributions and comments at that stage of the policy development would be of greater practical use, rather than later in the process, for example, commenting after a draft has been agreed between multiple agencies.

We also make this request because, as you likely know, the IGIS has already been (since 2017) an active participant in discussions with multiple agencies including NZSIS, GCSB, MFAT and DPMC on issues relevant to the JPS and on the context in which the JPS operates. For example: under the IGIS' Senate Inquiry we analysed the legal framework in which the JPS operates as well as analysing the JPS itself; we have considered relevant policies in other jurisdictions:



Thank you for your email. We have commenced the re-draft of the JPS 006 - Human Rights.

I am hoping to have the re-draft consulted internally before the end of February, at which point I will be moving roles and the agencies Compliance and Legal teams will take over. As I mentioned to yourself and last year, I have also been engaging with a number of other agencies such as MFAT, NZDF, DPMC, NZP etc. on human rights matters. We agreed to provide our draft policy for their comment, particularly on sections that relate to cooperation or notification of breaches, which I am also hoping to achieve before the end of February.

Once this internal and external consultation is complete, consultation with the OIGIS will follow. I should mention this is a complex policy that we need to ensure is fit-for-purpose going forward. My rough timeframes reflect the need for the agencies to allow for meaningful internal consultation in particular.

We look forward to engaging with your office on the revised policy.



Subject: DRAFT NZIC joint policy on management of human rights risk in overseas cooperation
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Dear colleagues (Police, MBIE, Customs, NZDF, MFAT, OIGIS)

As you may be aware, the NZIC has been reviewing its internal policy on managing human rights risk in overseas cooperation. The review is to reflect the revised Ministerial Policy Statement on Overseas Cooperation (MPS) issued by Minister Little which takes effect from 1 April 2021.

We are sharing a copy of the draft with the OIGIS for consultation in line with the MPS, and wish to also share it also with other NZInc agencies for any comments. We appreciate that it's a long document and much won't be relevant outside the NZIC, so draw your attention to the three key points of relevance to other agencies:

- Assessments of partners' human rights practices: The policy sets out a framework for the NZSIS and GCSB to assess and manage human rights risks in cooperation with foreign partners, including assessing their human rights practices to inform any risks involved with proposed cooperation. In the interests of ensuring that relevant information is available, as appropriate, across government, we may consult your agencies, and would in turn provide a copy of the human rights practice information we have compiled, see para [12] of the attached. Mitigations of human rights risk: in some cases, steps to mitigate human rights risk may be as minor as redactions but in rare cases may involve other agencies (e.g., if assurances that the death penalty would not be carried out in a particular case are required as a condition of cooperation), see paras [32]-[33].
- Information that may have been obtained through mistreatment: this section is drafted for compliance with legal obligations and the NZIC policy expectations in the MPS. Where such information is identified, the NZIC may need to pass it to another agency to act on (e.g. if it details a threat to life). We may also need to alert other agencies for their awareness (e.g. if the agency is also cooperating with the relevant foreign party).


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
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
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
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


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
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






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Pursuant to section 16(1)(e) of the Official Information Act 1982, the content of the above letter of 23 April 2021 from the IGIS to NZSIS and GCSB is provided in summary form.

Pursuant to section 16(1)(e) of the Official Information Act 1982, the content of the above letter of 21 June 2021 from the IGIS to NZSIS and GCSB is provided in summary form.

- Letter refers to discussions between the Office of the IGIS and the agencies on the JPS and sets out comments on outstanding areas.
- Letter provides information in relation to a suggestion from the IGIS on the JPS risk assessment framework, including partners' positions.
- Ministerial authorisation is required to provide intelligence, analysis or threat reporting to foreign parties and the JPS provides that the agencies may also request the Minister grant Approved Party status to an Authorised Party whose human rights situation is broadly comparable to New Zealand's. The letter provides comment on eligibility for Approved Party status; and on the criteria to be assessed and information provided to the Minister in consideration of whether to grant Approved Party status.
- Letter provides comments on the agencies' processes if they receive material that may have been obtained through mistreatment.
- Letter suggests that the JPS be declassified and published.
- Letter provides details regarding a number of smaller matters discussed with the agencies.
- Letter notes the IGIS's ongoing interest in this area, and offers to provides a copy of the JPS once it is finalised.





- thanks the IGIS for feedback, notes most feedback has been incorporated and offers comments on outstanding points.
- Noting that Ministerial authorisation is required to provide intelligence, analysis or threat reporting to foreign parties and the JPS provides that the agencies may also request the Minister grant Approved Party status to an Authorised Party whose human rights situation is broadly comparable to New Zealand's, the letter provides clarifications on the agencies' approach to eligibility for Approved Party status; and on the criteria to be assessed and information provided to the Minister in consideration of whether to grant Approved Party status.
- The letter provides information in relation to a suggestion from the IGIS on the JPS risk assessment framework.
- The letter responds to the IGIS suggestion that the JPS be declassified and published.
- The letter notes the IGIS's ongoing interest in processes if the agencies receive material that may have been obtained through mistreatment, and offers to provides a copy of the JPS once it is finalised.
