Roles and Powers of Community Boards

The Community Board has already been delegated the task of co-ordinating rural reserves and hall committees. It also has a major input into the development of Council's Long Term Plan.

The Community Board's prime objective is to be the interface between Council and the ratepayers and public of the Ward.

Role of Community Boards

The role of a Community Board is to (Section 52 Local Government Act 2002 [LGA]):

- (a) Represent and act as an advocate for the interests of the community.
- (b) Consider and report on all matters referred to it by the territorial authority, or any other matter of interest or concern to the community board.
- (c) Maintain an overview of services provided by the territorial authority within the community.
- (d) Prepare an annual submission to the territorial authority for expenditure within the community.
- (e) Communicate with community organisations and special interest groups within the community.
- (f) Undertake any other responsibilities that are delegated to it by the territorial authority.

Powers of Community Boards

A Community Board shall perform such functions and duties and exercise such powers as are delegated to it by Council from time to time.

Powers of Community Boards (Section 53 – LGA):

- A community board has the powers that are:
 - (a) Delegated to it by the relevant territorial authority in accordance with Clause 32 of Schedule 7 of the LGA.
 - (b) Prescribed by the Order in Council constituting its community.
- 2 The powers of a Community Board prescribed by Order in Council expire at the close of six years after the Order comes into force.
- 3 Despite subsection (1), a community board may not:
 - (a) Acquire, hold or dispose of property.
 - (b) Appoint, suspend or remove staff.

Powers Delegated to the Community Board by Council

- · The co-ordination of rural reserves and hall committees.
- To allocate the approved budget for the following activities in the area:
- Footpaths programme; Parks and Reserves discretionary spend; Public information signage.
- . To approve:

Temporary road closures for events (subject to administrative imperatives); Street names; Parades, collections and special uses of the roads; Changes to speed restrictions on local roads (subject to NZTA rules); Road closures.

Subject: Annual Tree Programme South 2022/23



Purpose of Report

1.1 The purpose of this Report is to advise Members of planned tree work in Ruatiti, Raetihi and Ohakune for the last Quarter of FY2021/22 and for the 2022/23 financial year.

Significance and Engagement, Social Impact

- 2.1 This report does not trigger the Significance and Engagement Policy.
- 2.2 This report does not trigger the Social Policy.

Background

- 3.1 Council has an annual budget for planned tree work throughout the District.
- 3.2 The planned tree schedule for work has been developed to ensure the community is notified and has the opportunity to feed back any concerns over planned work, and that Council Officers have the appropriate approval to allow work to proceed. The process entails presentation of the work list to the Ward Committee or Community Board for the area and notification to the property owner immediately adjacent to the Council property or road reserve where a tree is planned to be felled.
- 3.3 Tree work is for trees that are in decline, dead, or where a tree may have become a problem due to location or size. Stump grinding is also carried out; this is often completed a number of years after the tree has been felled, due to budgetary constraints.
- 3.4 Once a tree has been removed, the decision to replant must be made with appropriate species, size and location being considered. The tree programme notes where a replacement tree has been recommended. Planting of replacement trees is undertaken under the same budget.
- 3.5 Note that items will remain on the tree programme until the work is complete, as budget allows.

Discussion

- 4.1 It has been some time since the last Annual Southern Tree Programme. Due to staff turn over and recruitment processes, there has been no formal pipeline of tree works since mid-2021 therefore it has been difficult to engage Arborists. Any safety critical works have been carried out on an ad hoc basis however, the bulk of requests have not been actioned.
- 4.2 In order to improve our responsiveness to requests and to provide flexibility delivering the resulting work, Community & Recreational Facilities are in the process of engaging both local and external contractors providing a mix of capabilities to suit the works for our entire district.

The two main Arborist contractors who will service both North & South are Tree Truck and River City, both are Whanganui based and are Power Co. /Lines Co approved. These contractors will provide expert arborist opinions and will be in District for three or four days at a time, a couple of times a year. It is our intention that during their assignment these main contractors will also be reviewing and reporting on the status of our trees and following up on stumping etc. such that we may manage our trees in a more proactive manner. We are especially keen for these arborists to audit the Heritage trees.

The local contractors are being on-boarded and will be able to provide a responsive service to the more ad hoc requests.

4.3 Attached is a list of planned work for Ohakune, Raetihi & Ruatiti. Note, in May 2021 a Tree removal report was presented to Waimarino-Waiouru Community Board and declined. One of the stand of trees from that report (Snowmass, Ohakune) has been growing progressively worse. Tree Truck had been engaged to carry out powerline works in Raetihi and undertook an urgent de-limbing of the Lawson pine; the remainder of the stand is re-presented in this report as it requires further work

Financial Implications

Is there funding in the current Long-Term Plan / Annual Plan for these actions?

Yes

5.1 The budget for the southern part of the District (south of National Park) is \$32,000 for the 2021/22 financial year. This budget is allocated as \$8,000 for Raetihi and \$20,000 for Ohakune and \$4,000 for Ruatiti as per the Long-Term Plan. A similar level will be set for FY2022/23. Items will remain on the tree programme until the work is complete, as budget allows.

Next Actions

- 6.1 Once the proposed works are approved, the works will be allocated out to the appropriate contractor as described in the body of this report.
- 6.2 Progress will be provided monthly in the Capital Works update.

10 Capital Works and Members Request for Information

Members were provided with an update on planned Capital Works and other Items of interest in the Waimarino-Waiouru Ward in 2021/22. Relevant officers spoke to this report and answered Members' questions. Key Items discussed:

- R5 Speed Limits: pneumatic tube counters have been collecting speed and axle classification data throughout Ohakune as part of an accelerate counting programme to meet Council's annual target.
- R9 Shannon Street Road Widening: a Request for Service has been lodged for verge reinstatement opposite the sub-division.
- C4 Raetihi Swimming Pool: potentially the source of the leak has been identified; further investigations are required before it can be confirmed.
- C6 Tangiwai Reserve Development: Cr Nottage has been onsite mulching the Broom.
- C17 Vodafone Cell Tower: Officers advised a report is due to the next Board Meeting.
- C18 Moore Street Housing: an open day to showcase the properties, and the high level of insulation has been proposed.
- O2.1 Security Cameras (Ohakune): the Audit & Risk Committee recommended to Council the CCTV Policy be adopted. Members asked if cameras would be installed in Ohakune's Junction area by winter.
- O3 Te Ara Mangawhero: a Heads of Agreement has been signed with Ngāti Rangi, and applications for the Concession and Resource Consent are in the final stages of being prepared. Off-site construction has commenced and on-site will commence in Summer.

Members congratulated the team involved in removing Broom from the rail corridor at the Junction for their excellent work.
