Request for Information

Thank you for your Official Information Act 1982 (OIA) request dated 22 November 2022, in which you asked for information regarding Police's use of Automatic Number Plate Recognition (ANPR).

Responses to each of these questions can be found below.

Detective Lynch, in relation to real time tracking via ANPR, stated:

"as of 3 months ago [June 2022] we are able to access the entirety of the ANPR network without needing to flag vehicles as stolen" (https://www.newshub.co.nz/home/new-zealand/2022/09/covid-19-police-refuse-to-apologise-to-northland-trio-after-car-falsely-reported-stolen-to-access-database.html).

It has previously been stated that:

- only the stolen vehicle subset of the Vehicle of Interest (VOI) list on the NIA is shared with third party ANPR providers.
- vGRID was not been described as having a real time alert function in the Police user guide for non-stolen vehicles (as Auror does) (https://www.documentcloud.org/documents/22759497-vgrid-vibe-police-user-guide-streams-vault-anpr)
- Vehicle mounted ANPR cameras (police cars) do not link into ANPR databases (Auror & vGRID) and are only accessible through the boss system at the end / start of each shift for 48 hours. Police also stated that the VOI list for vehicle mounted ANPR is uploaded through the boss system at the end / start of a shift, not on a 15-minute cycle linked to the NIA like Auror and vGRID.

Questions and Information requested:

1. Are the Police now sharing more VOI lists than just the stolen vehicle subset?

No. The only vehicle of interest list made available outside of Police is the stolen vehicle list which is uploaded to our external website.

2. Please expand on meant by "in its entirety". Include a list of what the "ANPR network" is comprised of.

The article refers to the flagging of a vehicle licence plate as stolen within the National Intelligence Application (NIA) to trigger alerts to a specific vehicle of interest.

The "ANPR network" referenced by Detective Superintendent Lynch refers to the sources of ANPR information to which Police have access for the prevention or detection of crime or harm. A stolen vehicle alert will trigger notifications in the Auror and SaferCities platforms, as well as trigger an in-car alert to officers in ANPR equipped Police vehicles.

Where "entirety" is discussed, it refers to the ability to receive alerts from SaferCities, Auror, and Police owned ANPR vehicles (noting, however, that prior to June 2022, when the 'Plate of Interest' functionality was made available, it was not possible to track a vehicle on SaferCities platform).

3. There was no mention of real time / live alerts for sought vehicles (rather than stolen) in the vGRID police user guide, please provide any updated version of this and any information or material related to the new function.

The active detection function in the SaferCities platform ('Plates of Interest') was made available in June 2022. The user guide has been updated to reflect these changes. A copy of the updated guide is attached.

4. Any information related to a difference of fact from that listed above. If there is substantive documents, emails, or material, please provide a list of all available.

The attached guide has been updated by SaferCities from previous versions to contain instructions on how to operate the new 'Plates of Interest' active detection function.

It was also noted that new Auror features were proposed for trial in 2021, as suggested by OIA responses IR-01-22-27626 (https://www.documentcloud. org/documents/23129551-police-oia-additional-auror-features-trialled-august-2021-october-2022) and IR-01-22-22232 (https://www.documentcloud.org/documents/23114824-police-oia-vgrid-integration-of-their-own-anpr-september-2022). The OPC also provided their feedback on this in August 2021.

Please provide:

5. Details on the "additional features". What were they?

The additional functionality discussed in the responses you cite, refer to Auror's automatic video retrieval system. This feature allows a retail camera operator to make video footage available to Police through the Auror portal.

6. Who provided expert opinions on the new features?

To support innovation and improve our policing services, our staff were invited to propose new ideas and the automatic video retrieval system was selected. The functionality was built within the Auror platform based on the advice and feedback of Police staff. A trial and evaluation took place before adoption of the functionality. Internal subject matter experts including people with legal and privacy expertise informed the update of existing policy and procedures. 7. It is stated that several specific words of some acts required further consideration and advice during your considerations with the OPC and other experts. Please provide the specific words at issue and their respective section of statute.

A draft of the ANPR policy was reviewed by the Office of the Privacy Commissioner, Expert Panel of Emergent Technologies and internal subject matter experts including people with legal and privacy expertise. Further clarification and examples of when the serious threat to life or safety provision is met were included. The definition of 'serious threat' was updated to ensure consistency with the Privacy Act 2020. Further consideration was also given to the obligations under information Privacy Principles 10 and 11 of the Privacy Act 2020. The final ANPR policy document incorporated these changes and has been published on our web site which can be found here <u>https://www.police.govt.nz/about-us/publication/automatic-number-plate-recognition-police-manual-chapter-0</u>

We trust that you find this response helpful. If you are not satisfied with this response, however, you have the right to ask the Ombudsman to review Police's handling of your request. Information about how to do so is available at: www.ombudsman.parliament.nz.

vGRID SaferCity Platform

The vGRID SaferCity Platform is software for Police. It provides access to *live* and *historical* visual information. This includes live CCTV cameras, operator screens and other visual data including vehicle license plates (ANPR).

The platform also includes vGRID VAULT, providing Police with the ability to make requests for historical CCTV footage of victims and witnesses. They can be emailed a link which allows them to upload evidence (video, images or other), allowing the Police to receive evidence digitally without a physical visit.

vGRID SaferCity Platform has been in use by NZ Police since 2015, is constantly improving and has been designed in collaboration with Police. The platform promotes the philosophy that more effective and efficient Policing results when the community and public can more easily share live or historical information that is relevant and appropriate to Police.

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What are 'STREAMS'

STREAMS is Police access to *live* visual information from *CCTV* Video Security Cameras or *CCTV* Operator Screens from any authorised public agency, commercial or private entity via the Police trusted SaferCity Platform & Network.

Video Snapshots

User's can take a snapshot of any stream or alert using on screen buttons. The snapshot can then be emailed to a number of recipients (including the user's email), or simply downloaded to the user's device.





Clicking the **Capture Video Snapshot** downloads a JPG image of the stream onto the user's device. Clicking the **Email Video Snapshot** button captures a snapshot of the stream and opens a pop-up menu for the user to input details needed for emailing.

The pop-up menu then requires the user to enter the email addresses of the recipients, a message to go along with the snapshot, and to select whether or not they want the email sent to themselves.

The recipients box suggests entries based on the currently entered text, showing a drop-down menu of suitable recipients known to the system. These recipients can be selected at any time while the user is entering email addresses.



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If a recipient is not in the system, the user can enter any email address for a one time email. This email address is not added to the system.

Upon clicking **Send**, emails will be sent out to all recipients, with the snapshot, attached message, and user who sent the snapshot as seen below.

What is vGRID VAULT?

VAULT is an easy way for Police to request and obtain CCTV footage from a member of the public without the need for a physical visit. VAULT can also be used for transferring other evidential footage including images and files.

Vault is effectively a USB replacement; it allows Police to send a request to a witness' email address asking for any CCTV footage they may have. The witness can then upload the footage to the VAULT by way of a secure link that they receive in the initial email, this saves USB sticks, travel time, navigating unfamiliar CCTV systems. The result is that the footage that you want arrives straight to you, accompanied by a detailed report to preserve chain of evidence.

CCTV footage is requested by yourself as Police and can then be uploaded by a member of the public at a convenient time for them. This can be from either their PC desktops or Smartphone and there is no limit to the size of CCTV footage or the number of uploads they can do for you.

VAULT also preserves privacy by encrypting, 'hashing' and auditing the CCTV file transfer. The HashID can be used to validate that the evidence is the same files originally

uploaded (unedited) by the member of the public. Viewing can also be made private, just for you, your workgroup or other Police colleagues that you nominate in case you are away when the CCTV footage arrives. VAULT is also used to receive ANPR license plate exports in line with per Police ANPR policy (see vGRID ANPR (VIBE) module).

VAULT is not intended as a replacement for evidence.com, secure local Police file storage or IMT (Investigation Management Tool). CCTV footage and images obtained through VAULT should be stored appropriately within Police.

How to use VAULT – Overall Police Process

- 1. You may be talking with a member of the public and have jointly identified that they may have CCTV footage, images or other files that could be useful in support of a criminal case.
- 2. You discuss and agree the specifics of the CCTV footage that you require from the member of the public and ask for their details name and email address so that you can send them a Police VAULT request.
- 3. You create your VAULT request from the vGRID SaferCity Platform login and enter relevant Police Case ID file, their email address and a brief description of what you discussed and agreed with them. You can select the VAULT Upload group and who can see the uploaded evidence.
- 4. Member of the public receives your Police VAULT request via email and this includes an 'Open Vault' button.
- 5. Member of the public clicks the Open Vault button and is taken through instructions on how to upload their CCTV footage or evidential files to you. There is no size limit on what they can upload and the transfer is very fast. It is also secure (encrypted) and 'hashed' to ensure that their file upload is unable to be tampered with.

- 1. When you have completed your VAULT REQUEST then press Send request email to start the process.
- 2. You will receive a confirmation email of your VAULT request to the Member of the public. If their email address is not valid it will 'bounce' and you will also be informed of this via email.
- 3. The member of the public should receive an email like this.

The email will be sent to them from support@safercities.com Should your member of the public wish to query your VAULT request or ask questions by email, then when they REPLY to this email, it will be directed back to you so that you can answer.



4. Member of the public clicks **Open Vault** and follows the instructions.

5. This includes them first exporting their CCTV footage to a local directory before they can then upload to VAULT. This may be the same local PC they view their CCTV or another local PC that can receive and send emails & upload to VAULT.

6. When the member of the public completes their upload to VAULT, you will get another email confirming the CCTV footage or evidential data has been be securely transferred to you and is in your VAULT inbox.

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Member of the public needs to first EXPORT the relevant CCTV footage from their local CCTV system. They will first export and save this to a local directory on their PC.

The PC that they SAVE their EXPORT to will need to be able to (i) receive the Vault email from Police and then (ii) upload to VAULT so will need to have some sort of an internet connection. The VAULT transfer will be a secure internet transfer for them.

What is ANPR?

ANPR stands for **A**utomatic **N**umber **P**late **R**ecognition. ANPR data comes from a CCTV camera (or system) that can get a vehicle registration plate from the image of a vehicle which is driving past.

Police SaferCity Network

SaferCities and Police have engaged with private organisations and public authorities across New Zealand for the past five years to develop a network of providers and users of ANPR to assist Police in their Prevention First strategy and protect people and businesses across New Zealand.

vGRID 'ANPR' (VIBE)



SaferCities provides the vGRID SaferCity Platform and the professional subject matter expertise and confidence to organisations who join the Police national network of CCTV and ANPR cameras. Whilst each organisation agrees to make their video and ANPR available to Police, they can also share feeds and analysis with each other through the SaferCity network, leveraging MoUs, and improving their collective benefit as a public.

Public safety is further improved by real-time comparison and alerting against the stolen vehicle / stolen plate list made available by Police to SaferCities and third parties.

On the Police side, two services are provided through SaferCities' vGRID 'ANPR' (VIBE) system. Automatic alerting to Police of matches with the stolen vehicle list and the ability to search the vGRID ANPR database for up to 6 months with appropriate approval from a Senior Sergeant or above.

You must not classify a vehicle as stolen in NIA if the only purpose is to track that vehicle and it has not been stolen.



The detail of these tailored functions are described overleaf.

Security & Privacy

SaferCities and Police comply with the Privacy Act 2020 requirements; through a privacy impact assessment and architecture of the vGRID SaferCity platform and processes, providing a secure wall between Police and SaferCities' information. Outside of this 'privacy wall' the standalone data provided does not constitute Personal Information under the Privacy Act.



Overview of vGRID 'ANPR' (VIBE)

SaferCities have worked closely with Police to provide a Police-defined, userfriendly display of number plate information (NPI) obtained by a camera from anywhere on the nationwide Police SaferCity network. This also includes any previous Police comments and history of that vehicle recorded within the vGRID ANPR (VIBE) system.



An ANPR alert can be displayed at Police Communications Centres for immediate dispatch, District Command Centres for operations and/or deployment of prevention resources.

Alerts received by these methods can be restricted to a relevant Area (jurisdiction) or tailored by the Police user to be a specific plate. More user-defined alert options (for targeted alerts) are planned in future software development.

vGRID ANPR (VIBE) Database

The NPI captured by the national Police SaferCity network can be accessed for a user-defined period. As this data is not considered private information, there are no issues under the Privacy Act 2020. Specific number plates can be searched, and results displayed in 'Heat' maps, time/frequency graphs or Excel for further analysis.

Police ANPR Policy and Searching

Police have provided SaferCities with their recent ANPR Policy outlining the constraints and authority levels for searching the vGRID ANPR database, enabling Police to comply with their legislative and policy requirements. The benefits derived from reviewing the vGRID ANPR database are significant when searching for a suspect or potential witness plate in a major investigation such as a murder, or proactively for a firearms operation.

Automatic alerts are sent out and display on your Chrome web browser when an incoming License plate matches our stolen place / stolen vehicle list in the Police NIA database.

A 'whoop-whoop' alert sounds if notifications are enabled.

Clicking on the alert provides more information about the alert (photos, location comments) as shown overleaf

Not all sources are 100% accurate so we need you to check the validity of the data with the picture.

You can also add additional information about the vehicle alert should this be useful.
