Hi Louise,

Perhaps this is just the straw that is breaking the camel for me today, but the short answer is that No I don't have an SME to take this on, and I suspect that James won't either. Not that we don't want to be transparent, because we do, but this one is big. It will require input not only from our teams (to answer the 'who/what' question), but also from procurement (to get contract dates/COI records etc) and finance (for the spend).

So I'm inclined to say can we ask for an extension right now please because we'll probably need

it. Just in my area for the past six months I can think of approximately three or four procurements that might be captured, and that's not even across all ETS-related work. We're probably talking 10-20 or more over that time? Some small, some large.

We're going to need significant help from central teams – including yours, but also more specifically within the wider Climate Group.
