Israel: Jonathan Zadka, Director of the Economic Affairs dep, Economic Affairs Division

Talking Points:

- We are pleased that Ambassador Coulson-Sinclair could participate in the AgriFood week with leading kiwi companies in October 2022. It allowed us to explore the Israeli food and ag-tech ecosystem. Prospect for New Zealand companies to connect with counterparts across the sector exist.
- We understand further opportunities for New Zealand to expand our engagement in the economic and trade sphere exist with upcoming events such as Cyber Week in June 2023 and a further potential New Zealand AgriTech delegation.
- A gap in accurate data available publicly means that we do not have a full picture of our twoway trade record. We are pleased that our missions are looking at ways to work together to better understand the commercial opportunities available.

ITAG/GTAGA:

- New Zealand's membership of the Inclusive Trade Action Group (ITAG) and the Global Trade and Gender Arrangement (GTAGA) are an important part of our "Trade for All" agenda and ongoing efforts to ensure trade delivers for all members of our society. We would welcome Israel's participation in both initiatives, and are happy to engage with officials on any questions arising or to provide more information as needed.
- We are pleased to note that colleagues from the MFA have been in contact with our trade team in WLN who have provided further information on the ITAG/GTAGA.
- **Israel-UAE Closer Economic Partnership Agreement**: we'd be interested in understanding how Israel's CEPA with UAE is progressing following ratification ^{s6(a)}
- If asked on engagement under the New Zealand -Israel Technological Innovation, Research and Development agreement: We welcome Israeli ideas for engagement under the agreement, though note that our Ministry of Business, Innovation and Employment is already heavily committed in this area.

Background brief: Science, Technology, Innovation

- 1. In March 2020, the Agreement between the Government of the State of Israel and the Government of New Zealand on Cooperation in Technological Innovation, Research and Development (the Agreement) was signed. The Agreement was initiated much earlier, in 2017, intended to faciliate collaboration between New Zealand and Israel in areas of mutual interest in innovation; however, to date, no projects have arisen as a result of the Agreement. ^{s6(a)}
- 2. Israel is an Associate Member of Horizon Europe, the European Union's Framework Programme for Research and Innovation. New Zealand is expected to become an Associate Member to Horizon Europe in mid-2023, specifically to Pillar Two: Global Challenges and European Industrial Competitiveness, subject to Cabinet and Parliamentary approval. Association of both countries will provide a further avenue for collaboration between our research communities, and help address common challenges including climate change, biodiversity, food security and health.
- 3. Israel is known for its high R&D spend: one of the highest in the world. According to OECD data, Israel's R&D spend in 2020 was 5.4 per cent of GDP. By comparison, New Zealand's R&D spend in 2019 was only 1.4 per cent of GDP. However, in recent years Israel has openly questioned to what extent this high spend is resulting in impact; both on the quality of research as well as wider economic and social impact. Increasing New Zealand's R&D spend to 2% of GDP by 2030, alongside refining policy settings on prirotisation and long-term impact, is a key goal of this Government as part of Te Ara Paerangi Future Pathways, the reform of the New Zealand science system. Learning from Israel's experience would be of interest.

New Zealand, Canada, Chile, Mexico, with Costa Rica and Ecuador also requesting membership. It has a broad focus on inclusive trade issues (incluiding indigenous trade, environment and labour, and SMEs). The GTAGA is a trade instrument to promote women's economic empowerment, New Zealand's first, and comprises New Zealand, Canada, Chile, Mexico, Peru, Colombia, with Costa Rica and Ecuador about to sign, and Argentina also having requested memebrship.

Economic and innovation links

Both sides agreed that available trade data undersold levels of economic connectivity between Israel and New Zealand. Jonathan Zadka, Director of the Economic Affairs Department, welcomed the appointment of New Zealand's new Honorary Consul Isaac Bentwich who had expertise in the technology and innovation fields. Zadka encouraged both countries to consider delegations from New Zealand to promote cooperation. Future conferences on smart agriculture and cyber technology might be good starting points.

Zadka raised the bilateral Innovation and Technology Agreement and noted it would soon receive 11 its final approval by the Israeli government. This agreement would provide a formal avenue for matching funding. (Comment: the Knesset has since ratified the Agreement on 27 April, which opens the way for the Agreement to enter into force subject to the provisions of the Agreement.) s6(a)

On the Integrated Trade and Gender Initiative, Israel noted that more in-depth discussion was 13 needed. We offered for WLN to brief Morav and his team but noted at the same time that the Israeli Embassy in Wellington had contacted the relevant division in Wellington. Morav noted Israel's Released under the appreciation for the Small Advanced Economies Initiative. We reflected on how the New Zealand delegation had welcomed the opportunity to meet in person in Basel and encouraged Israel to prioritise participation in Singapore later in the year.
