Thank you for your Official Information Act (OIA) request of 3 March 2024 for:

I request under the official information act the titles and descriptions of all seminars, workshops, lectures (or guest lectures) held by the Bank between 1 September 2023 and 1 March 2024. I am only interested in subject area sessions (related to economic and social themes) so please exclude anything from the corporate side of the Bank's operations (HR, finance, IT etc).

Please include the name of the presenter(s), the description of the event, and any papers or notes supplied for the event (i.e. academic articles or briefing notes).

As noted in our earlier correspondence, the timeframe for this response was extended to 10 April 2024, to allow for the necessary consultations required to make a decision on this release.
