I would like to obtain details on the distribution of students and their marks for the following scholarships over the years 2021, 2022 and 2023: Calculus, Chemistry, Physics, Statistics.

I would like to see how many students got each possible mark out of the paper total (e.g. how many students got 24/32, 25/32, etc.).

This request is similar to a request made to NZQA in 2021 by Albert but I would like to see the updated data from the 2021-2023 papers.

¹ Maximum scores vary by scholarship subject and year. Most, but not all, scholarship subjects have three questions (max score of 24). For those subjects that have more than three questions, effort has been made over the last few years to bring the number of questions down from five (max score of 40) to four (max score of 32) or three; or from four questions down to three.
