Thank you so much for taking the time at the end of the day to meet with Bernie and I. It was good to meet and develop a sense of what you are seeking to achieve, I believe there is great potential to develop a wonderful resource for the Nelson community. We visited the site on triday and were impressed with the space. Some of the existing large spaces would easily convert to communal multi-purpose spaces and if the bedrooms were gutted the spaces would make great open work spaces with some shared access meeting rooms (small and medium size) along with great storage and resource production areas. It was easy to envisage how the access could be altered and the site redeveloped with Salisbury School remaining a secure safe site for the residential students.

Attached please find a brief for Nelson and a range of plans of various plans that have been developed to date. I have provided some information below re the nature of each of the projects:

- Riselaw a refurbishment which has RTV & RTD collocated with RTLB also in the space.
- Awapuni a refurbishment which includes RTD and RTV with separate work spaces and shared communal and multipurpose space
- Tikipunga a refurbishment which includes RTD and RTV with separate work spaces and shared communal and multipurpose space
- Hamilton North a new build with RTV and RTD located with Hamilton North admin and outreach team and utilises a shared multipurpose and communal spaces
- Tauranga a new build which is a base for RTV and RTD with communal spaces and multipurpose space
- Wellington starting as a refurbishment with a new addition this was all but rebuilt and accommodates RTV only.

Many thanks for taking time to meet yesterday. I am pleased that we can plan to co-locate Van Asch and BLENNZ at the Salisbury School site along with regional RTLB staff.

And also pleased that we are likely to have a few sources to provide useful design input from previous initiatives.

As mentioned I'm hopeful that the space at Hurley House at Salisbury will be able to accommodate all three parties and also retain some common meeting space that all can use. As noted MOE has already approved funding for the building upgrade and we are now able to commence planning.

To aid planning can you confirm just how many staff you expect to have based at the Salisbury premises? I will need to apply the MOE space entitlement rules but at the same time I fully expect that some entropy will follow ie the design will expand to fill a vacuum. As we agreed, there is not much point in refurbishing 90% of a building and leaving the last 10% fallow

I will get familiar with the entitlement riles for sensory schools and apply them along with the standards for RTLB. I will also touch base with a few of the useful contacts -9(2)(a), 9(2)(a) for a start. There is a good chance we would want to use designers who have worked well before at Riselaw or Hamilton North.

At this stage I am about to appoint a project manager to start preparing scope of works. The project manager will be encouraged to get involved with design early as I see that the design element may be our slowest stage. Hence there is every chance the project manager could start working with a designer within a few weeks.

Naturally the design will involve consultation with you and your staff. We won't be progressing far without feedback from your teams, obviously.

For now let me know the base information to work on your respective entitlement areas and I will check that our initial goals are feasible.

Trust that today you will get a chance to view Hurley House and the meeting room at the end in particular. The building has potential to become a constructive hub for a range of support services and replicate the add value you have already observed in other centres.

I have done some calculations and if we combine the schools the total would be the following:

BLENNZ – 3.6 FTE – 54m2 net Ko Taku Reo – 6 FTE – 168m2 Total = 222

Combined 9.6 FTE - 202m2

Therefore if they wanted to maximise space then the accommodation would be better off just using their FTE separately.

So the question I will need some guidance on should we be adding some additional capacity to allow for future growth with both these schools? What should we be building to? If we were to increase BLENNZ by 1 to 4.6FTE and did the same to Ko Taku Reo:

BLENNZ – 4.6 FTE – 154m2 net Ko Taku Reo – 7 FTE – 178m2 Total = 332

I have checked in with Network and they don't have data for either of these SRC so not able to do any extrapolations currently.

We have limited budget and it is likely that we are going to need additional funding.

RTLB are different as they are not a resource centre so we propose providing 15m2 per FTE*occupation time (feedback is that they are in the office half of the time).



I had to front up to 22 RTLB yesterday re possibility of moving.

Did not disclose where they might be moving to.

I do need to see more of the actual space offered so I can consider/plan/options.

Ellie and I have had open communication which I appreciate. We agreed to embargo release until yesterday.

Very Very disappointed ko taku reo and BLENNZ released to their staff last week ahead of agreed time.

Made it very difficult for both of us to manage.

What time Thursday please?

My board is very concerned we may well be accused of not looking after staff well-being. They feel moe has not been considerate or communicative regarding the master plan and they are being pushed and shoved.

Last count this is our 7th move for RTLB. Not professionally acceptable Rua.

Has this been put to MoE?

I now have RTLB suggesting the stress of this development/reshuffle is causing major anxiety. I cannot afford to lose the highly professional team we have employed over the last twelve years. Our national survey results are in the top 3% and have been so consistently year after year. I want them to continue delivering this high quality service without the constant impediment of yet another move.

This proposal could well be a legal issue for my board as employer.

MSS board has been totally supportive of the service since transformation. Decisions made and delivered by national office puts us legally in a possibly delicate situation.

It just needs one RTLB to declare they have felt threatened/unsafe by this shifting and shifting again into what might be considered inadequate sub standard accommodation to put my board into a legally difficult situation.

National Office needs to appreciate there is a possible issue here.

If this becomes a legal issue or need for mediation MSS board will hand this over to MoE to sit down at the table as this has been forced on us without any consultation.

I have this morning advised our insurers of a possible legal issue.

Please note key construction and delivery dates are yet to be confirmed but the work will be achieved during the xmas holiday break to achieve the least disruption to school operations.

The construction component of the project will be delivered by local business Fitzgerald Construction Ltd.

Fitzgerald is well aware of the peak traffic times for the Salisbury school driveway and St Patricks school traffic and will tailor the requirements accordingly, i.e delivery times scheduled outside of peak drop-off and pick-up times.

Mô taku hệ, apologies that it has taken so long to provide information to you. I do want to acknowledge on behalf of our project team that we do appreciate that we are working on your school site. The three user groups are also extremely grateful for you hosting them.

Here now is an update of where we are at:

- Preliminary design (see attached) The area for this building was assigned by the larger schools project. In placing the building we have been very conscious of traffic disruption, separation from the other schools and the heritage tress and buildings in the vicinity. Redbox Architects are lead design.
- Iwi consultation We have been in dialogue with Rangitane and will continue this through the design process.
- Infrastructure we will need to connect to the existing services along Salisbury Road.
 Stormwater will be by soak pit. We will liaise to do the connections outside of school times.
- Stage 1 programme The contractor will complete school access plan and site safety plan for
 your approval prior to establishment. We need to relocate two buildings from Waimea College
 during the summer holidays. We propose that the best way to do this safely is to erect site
 fencing in December after the school closes, then bring the buildings into the secure
 compound in January. A Building Consent application has been lodged for the foundations.
- Stage 2 programme the designers are working through developed design now and should submit for building consent in March. Construction would begin upon receipt of the consent.
- Outline Plan this is the resource consent planning. You will be aware that the TDC have concerns about traffic on Salisbury Rd. The submission for this building was done on the basis that the staff are already using the site. Our planner thought that this would have no impact on your new school.
- Contractor we have Fitzgerald Construction engaged to bring the relocatable buildings over.
 Fitzgerald are very good in schools. They know how to manage health and safety and
 consideration of students and staff. Fitzgerald have only just received notification so are
 currently preparing their programme, health and safety and other information. As that comes
 through I will make sure we share that with you.
- Communications this has clearly been lacking. Going forward we can add you to our fortnightly meetings on Thursdays and will update you formally after these meetings even if you do not attend.

We welcome and look forward to any comment you may have on the above.

We did speak a couple of weeks back.

I wanted to let you know that Fitzgerald Construction have now been formally engaged to remove two buildings and then to reinstate the grass area before term starts in 2023.

Obviously we will want to do a prestart covering off H&S, access and disruption.

Fitzgerald are preparing docs now so will let them do that and then we can arrange a prestart meeting.

Kia Ora rā koutou,

Apologies for the delay in this. Please see below the korero on our journey with this whenua to review and think about collaboration before meeting together.

'People have always been drawn to Te Tauihu o te Waka a Māui, the northern South Island. From the mineral belt running from Rangitoto Island south to Lakes Rotoiti and Rotorua, the first people procured metasomatized mudstone from which stone tools were made. The estuarine areas to the west and east of the mineral belt provided ideal sites for settlement. A climate conducive to kumara cultivation added to Te Tauihu's value. Although they have left behind a rich archaeological record, exactly who the first peoples to settle in Whakatū is shrouded in myth. 'Waitaha' is the name often used to

describe these people.

Tribes of Kurahaupō waka origin later settled the area. Ngāti Mamoe, Ngāti Tūmatakōkiri and Ngāi Tara were early occupants, followed by Ngāti Kuia, Rangitāne, and Ngāti Apa. These Kurahaupō peoples bequeathed to the history of Whakatū the oral traditions of Māui and Kupe. One such tradition relates to the hill range running behind Nelson, which according to tradition, was part of Māui's fishing line used by the Polynesian explorer to fish up the North Island. The Kupe traditions also account for some of Whakatu's distinctive geographical features.

From the late 1820s tribes from Käwhia and Taranaki began to arrive. Ngāti Koata were the first of the new arrivals, followed by Ngāti Tama, Te Ātiawa, and Ngāti Rārua. Tangata Heke would come to occupy land from the western Marlborough Sounds through to Onetahua. Within 15 years a New Zealand Company settlement had been established in Whakatū.

The relationship between Māori and the Crown was often tested. Between 2000 and 2004 the Waitangi Tribunal heard the Treaty claims of Te Tauihu iwi. The Tribunal found that at 1840 all 8 Te Tauihu iwi had legitimate customary rights. In 2010 Rangităne signed a Treaty of Waitangi settlement with the Crown. The settlement acknowledged the Crown's failure to properly protect Rangităne's interests and in August 2014 the iwi purchased the land on which Salisbury School stands.'

We have also contracted 9(2)(a), founder of Nelson based strategy, communications, and engagement firm 9(2)(a) to work with us over the next six months to support us on the exciting journey of developing our education and matauranga strategy. In collaboration with Johny, we believe in the principles of lifelong learning and strongly advocate for kaupapa Māori approaches to developing skills and capabilities. 9(2) has said, "Education is not something that begins and ends when you enter the education system. The matauranga lens is one we need to apply right across our lifetime to understand how we can maximise opportunities to support whanau growth and development - both professionally and personally." We are so excited to commence this piece of critical work and are looking forward to collaborating with our Te Tauihu schools upon completion.

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1. Introduction

The purpose of this Methodology Statement is to outline the site logistics, health and safety and environmental management protocols in conjunction with the scheduled activities. This document will also highlight where necessary how the proposed construction activity will comply with the parameters set out in the construction documentation provided.

The Construction Methodology Statement describes the construction works and key activities to be undertaken on the site in relation to this Contract.

2. Description of Works

The following provides a broad description of the likely nature of activities to occur over the Construction of the concrete foundation beam with timber pile & relocation of the classrooms.

Prior to any works commencing physically on site, a Site-Specific Safety Plan will be provided. More about this document is covered in the section on Site Logistics.

A quality assurance checklist specific to this project will be invented through the construction process. This checklist will be submitted in our regular Construction reports to ensure that every important step of the project is under scrutiny and thus obtaining the best result or finish intended.

CONSTRUCTION METHODOLOGY

Site Establishment

On possession of site, temporary fencing, silt barriers will be erected demarcating the safe working zones. Site signage, including hazard notifications will be erected. Site utility buildings will be located on site.

Particular attention will be paid to the erection of this fence ensuring that it is sturdy and not easily penetrated due the high safety risk of School work. Silt barriers will be included around the perimeter fencing where required.

There appears to be no restriction on working hours, delivery of building will generally fall outside of the standard working hours. However, the standard working hours on site will be as follows:

Health & Safety Management

Prior to the project commencing on site, the Health & Safety Manager will provide a comprehensive Site-Specific Safety Plan. This document outlines protocols and mitigation strategies in relation to health and safety.

Site Access & Traffic Management Plan

A site-specific Traffic Management Plan for construction activities that will describe the deliveries, traffic path, pedestrian path, will be issued prior to commencing construction. The Traffic Management Plan will include information on the following:

Overview

- Traffic will be limited to the designated parking area inside the construction zone.
- Delivery vehicles will be escorted into, from and while reversing on-site, with site gates to be closed on entry and exit. Exit from the construction will be monitored, no reversing from the construction zone onto Nelson Street.
- Visitors will be escorted from the access gate. Children (U15) will not be allowed on-site at any time.

- All neighboring property is owned by Salisbury School. Any damage made to property will be made good before completion of contract.
- Access to an area of the playing fields will be temporarily restricted during the landing of buildings. Currently this has been programmed to happen during school holidays (or during the weekend).

Site Fencing / Hoardings

Delivery areas will be located within the site compound - all material deliveries for the works shall be made via the vehicle entry. Care shall be taken around school drop off and pick up times.





You have asked me to provide some commentary on the tendered cost to deliver the facility for Education Support on the Salisbury School campus. You thought that I should give some background and justification to increased budget.


- We always knew that the budget was going to be stretched. The original budget had a redevelopment rate applied to an area – not a new build rate.
- The budget did not account for the fact that we are a green field site with no access, parking, or infrastructure services. The cost to make the site ready for the build is in excess of \$400,000.
- The project group have been cognisant of costs and know that the funding has not been approved. We have made all decisions with a mind to keeping costs to a minimum on the project.
- Your idea to incorporate existing buildings tuned out to be very efficient, with Redbox being
 able to incorporate those into the facility without any major alterations. In the proposed scheme
 we are keeping the floor structure, wall and roof framing, interior wall and ceiling linings, high
 quality mechanical systems, lighting and power. Lestimate the savings on the use of these
 buildings to be \$366,000 (\$1500 / m2).
- The buildings have different colour roofs, and both need cutting into for new valleys. It did not seem practicable to paint one piece and doctor existing roofing, so it was decided to re-roof the entire building with a new 100 % warranty.
- The existing wall cladding does not comply with the Building Code for weathertightness. It is
 'garage type' cladding direct fixed to the frame on old style building paper. There are no
 flashings around the windows that divert water to the outside face of the cladding. When FCL
 moved these buildings to the Waimea campus, we knew that they would not sustain another
 lift and relocate without significant remedial work required.
- The windows need to come out for the cladding fix, and have new liners for the additional wall
 thickness from the 'drained cavity' cladding system. The windows are serviceable but only
 single glazed. It was thought that it would be sensible to bring these up to building code
 standard, but this is an area where a saving could be made if we reinstated the existing.
- The height of the foundation system is a frustration to me. We pushed back hard on this but as
 you know the council here is insistent on their flood modelling, having had major flooding
 through this zone in recent times. The feedback from Redbox is that if you want to argue
 minimum floor heights you need to provide your own independent flood modelling (at some
 expensel). Not only does the height mean additional bracing requirements, it also means
 additional costs for steps, ramps and decks.
- The fire alarm and evacuation systems need additional provisions for the specific user groups here, which has added cost to the specified systems.
- Both Redbox and FCL have been very clear on keeping the level of interior fit out to a
 minimum. We did have to engage a specialist interior designer due to the specific needs of our
 deaf / hard of hearing and blind / low vision users. It should be noted that some of the spaces
 will be used for teaching and whanau hui, not just administration. Upon review, it is my opinion

that the level of fit out is very modest and much less than recently delivered projects for the MoE.

I hope this is helpful. I am happy to provide more detail and support to this if required.

Please find attached our accessibility report for this project based on D1/AS1, NZS4121 and the OT recommendations provided by Rebecca.

Also attached markup of the buildings approach for clarification of some of these features, and manufacturers data sheet for the selected perimeter fencing system.





The Developer is altering, extending or constructing new Works adjacent to Network Tasman's Distribution.

Network and will install the Works at the Developer's sole expense and subject to the terms of this Agreement.

Following Livening of the Works the Developer acknowledges ownership of the Works will be vested in Network Tasman.

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

Originating from Te Puna o Waikoropupu ki Mohua (Golden Bay), it emerges from the depths of the marbles caves beneath Takaka Hill. 
Tāniko is a unique Māori weaving tradition, that has been represented in the design of our NBRTLB logo, in gold, adorning two maunga (mountains) representative of our connection to the rohe (area) we service.

Tāniko was carefully chosen as it's technique is similar in nature to that of RTLB, a weaving technique that involves carrying behind the work whenu (threads) that are not required for the pattern, however, as each colour is needed it is brought to the front of the work and wrapped around all the others. Each whenu (thread) plays a part in either forming the pattern or it supports the structure of the overall piece-'te whiringa o ngā aho rau', the weaving together of many strands to make one that is resilient.





Ngā Pouwhirinaki o Te Tai o Aorere





Niho taniwhā- the teeth of the taniwhā. Refers to the pursuit of knowledge about our natural world and the world around us.

Aramoana-pathways to the sea. Symbolic of the pathways that stem from the moana (sea) of Te Tai o Aorere (Tasman/Nelson Bays district) connecting to all the water ways and awa (rivers), to provide for the outward districts we service.

Ähuru Möwai (Rangitäne Preference)

An old/ancient word/phrase from an old Rangitane karakia. 'He oriori mo Tüteremoana' or, 'a karakia/lullaby for Tüteremoana. Tüteremoana was the most significant descendant of Tara, who was the spearhead of Ngai Tara, a Rangitane hapū. Ngāi Tara occupied land all the way from Te Tauihu to Hawkes Bay, but mainly resided in Te Tauihu and Wellington, hence Wellington in Te Reo Māori, 'Te Whanganui a Tara', or, 'the great bay of Tara'. This name means a safe haven or a safe place of shelter and in my opinion, pays respect to the whakapapa of the whenua, the whakapapa of Rangitane, but also the values and purpose of this whare.

Te Whakamarumaru

This ingoa is slightly similar in meaning, however, means a shelter or protective space for people. It talks to the inclusiveness of people in a safe/protective space. I think this also pays respect to the purpose of the whare in relation to the different entities/groups, however, lacks the level of historical detail and whakapapa Ahuru Möwai provides.
