Request for information

Thank you for your Official Information Act 1982 (OIA) request of 13 May 2024. You asked for information regarding off-duty interventions.

My response to each part of your request can be found below.

 Please provide the assigned officer details for the following QID numbers, alongside a copy of the current NZ Police, off-duty interventions policy. QID#JDBE21, QID#NBG786, QID#GTEM61, QID#LGCJL1, QID#NMJGD6, QID#HCEQR8, QID#TJCBA7, QID#BBYI48.

Officer details for the QID's you have provided are withheld pursuant to 9(2)(a) OIA to protect the privacy of natural persons. The QID's provided are sufficient for NZ Police to identify these employees if required. I have weighed the public interest in releasing the names verses the risk of harm to officers, and have decided the public interest does not outweigh the potential for harm.

Your request for the NZ Police off-duty interventions policy is declined pursuant to s18(d) OIA in that the information requested is publicly available. 2 May I also please request the policies that apply regarding officers engaging their policing authority while under the influence of alcohol.

Policies which may apply to officers engaging their policing authority whilst under the influence of alcohol are the off-duty intervention policy (mentioned above) and the NZ Police Code of Conduct and Our Values which set out expected standards of behaviour on and off-duty.
