Complicated claim definition

Business Rule

Rule Purpose This ensures claims are identified accurately as complicated claims so that ACC makes a cover decision within the relevant legislative timeframes.

A <u>claim</u> must be considered to be a <u>complicated claim</u> if at least one of the following is true:

- the <u>claim type</u> assigned to the claim is any of the following:
 - a treatment injury complex claim type
 - a sensitive complex claim type
 - a work-related mental injury complex claim type
 - a work-related gradual process complex claim type
- the <u>date of lodgement</u> of the claim is greater than 12 months from the <u>date of injury</u> of the <u>client</u> for that claim


