Data & Insights	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Due to issues with use of the reconciliation app, daily data in EMS for vote and enrolment counts is unreliable. This means any data or insights that splits vote/enrolment counts by day should not be made public (other than what already has) and will be of limited use for planning/estimate purposes in 2026, more so in some electorates than others. Many counts for advance voting days (particularly SV and enrolments) were not entered. ED counts are taken from the preliminary results and need to be updated to official results to account for voting places that didn't get results in on election night (thus, making ED counts accurate for Overseas Votes).

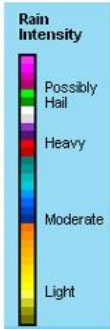


Current Weather

Severe Weather Outlook

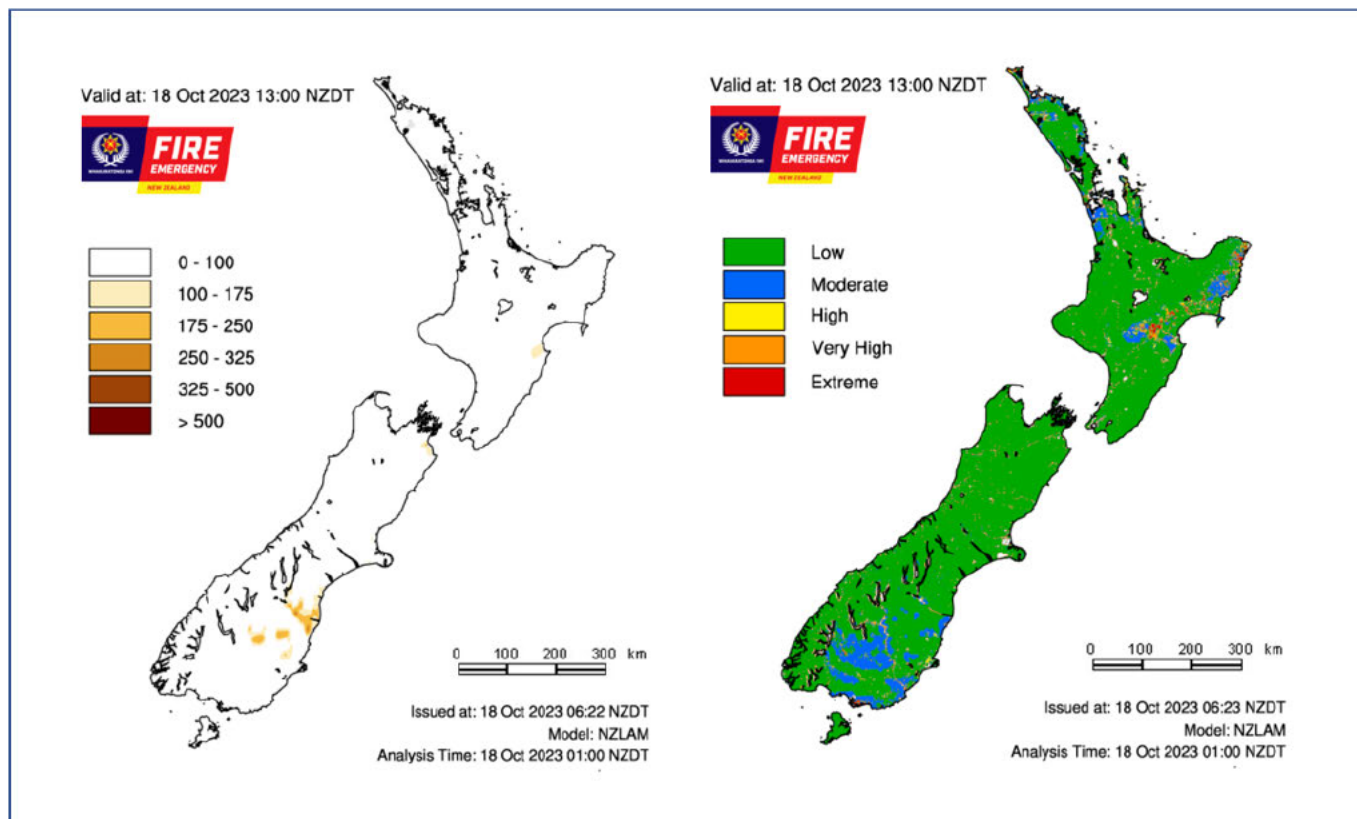
A weak ridge of high pressure predominates over central parts of the country from tomorrow through to Sunday, while a low to the north moves southeast and passes close to the northeastern North Island on Saturday.

This low is likely to bring a period of easterly rain to the northern North Island during Friday and Saturday. There is low confidence that this rainfall may reach warning criteria about Northland, northern Auckland, and Coromandel Peninsula.
