






Severe Weather Outlook

A low in the north Tasman Sea is expected to move south eastwards past the north eastern North Island late Friday and Saturday, with an associated rain band affecting the northern North Island. A ridge of high pressure will predominate over central and southern New Zealand from Friday to Monday.

There is low confidence that rainfall amounts associated with the rain band could reach warning criteria about Northland on Friday and Saturday morning, and about Auckland, Great Barrier Island, Coromandel Peninsula and northern parts of western Bay of Plenty on Saturday.
