I would like to request information on the 2023 NZ Scholarship Exam, specifically the distribution of students' marks (i.e., the number of students attaining each possible score) for the following NZ Scholarship subjects:

Health and Physical Education, Agricultural and Horticultural Science, Geography, Economics, English, Physics, Biology, Chemistry, Statistics, and Calculus.

Response

As part of your request for a breakdown by specific scholarship subjects, the scholarship data for 2023 for NZ Scholarship Health and Physical Education, Agricultural and Horticultural Science, Geography, Economics, English, Physics, Biology, Chemistry, Statistics, and Calculus is presented by:

- Academic Year: 2023.
- Scholarship Subject.
- Score:
 - \circ Health and Physical Education possible to score between 0 24.
 - \circ Agriculture and Horticulture Science– possible to score between 0 24.
 - Geography possible to score between 0 24.
 - \circ Economics possible to score between 0 24.
 - English possible to score between 0 24.
 - Physics possible to score between 0 32.
 - Biology possible to score between 0 24.
 - \circ Chemistry possible to score between 0 32.
 - Statistics possible to score between 0 32.
 - \circ Calculus possible to score between 0 32.

Note: Where a score (mark) is not in the data, there were no students who achieved that score.

• Count of students who achieved a particular score.

Scholarship standards may be assessed by examination or submission. Students with an entry in scholarship standards may or may not attend the examination session.

Students who attempt the standard will have their work assessed and a score (mark) given depending upon the number of items/questions.

Single subject scholarships are awarded to approximately the top 3% of the cohort in each scholarship subject and Outstanding scholarship results are given to approximately the top 0.3% of the cohort. The actual number of single subject (Scholarship and Outstanding Scholarship) scholarships awarded will vary with the decision being made by the Technical Overview Group Assessment.
