With the recent pupping season female sea lions are very actively moving around the Tomahawk community on the roads. Locals have reported them around the gun emplacements and other parts of the community. The Board has raised this issue with the City Council many times over the last 6 years, especially in the last 2-3 years as mother's and pups have been significantly more active in the Tomahawk and Smaills area.

Other issues around poor driving behaviour have also been raised by the Board in this area and the community were consulted a few years ago about a programme of curb protrusions and judder bars to slow traffic in the area. This programme was never undertaken despite the Board having this request remain in its community plan and long term plan submission. Yes happy with your response.

Just for further information, we are regularly asked for speed humps to be installed at various places throughout the city. One topical site at the moment is Pukehiki on Highcliff Rd. The township was part of the Peninsula speed reduction to 40km/h and we seem to be getting quite low compliance to the lowered speed limit. Bearing that in mind, I think it is very likely we will see similar situations through the schools speed reductions. These areas will see traffic calming installed before we would consider places like Tomahawk and obviously these sites can only be done as budgets allow.

Incidentally, there has been little support for safety projects or speed limit reductions from the community board and they haven't done anything to gauge local feeling towards traffic calming for Tomahawk, at least as far as I'm aware.
