- a) note the purpose of the report, as determined by Governing Body in response to the Local Board's One Local Initiative proposal, "to assess and report back on whether the whole of Liston Village is still required for open space purposes", and the limitations of scope that this required, in particular that the report does not consider the value that social housing on the site might add in contrast to open space purposes.
- b) note that despite the limited scope of the report, to focus on open space value and exclude social housing value, it does not categorically recommend Option 1 (the total open space option).
- c) reconfirm its commitment to the long-term provision of seniors social housing on the current Liston Village site, with at least 25 units, as the goal of our One Local Initiative in the 2018-2028 Long Term Plan process.
- d) reiterates it is flexible regarding how that goal is achieved, and to that end supports Option 2 and Option 3 as proposed in the report.
- e) confirm it is open to further discussion of options that provide at least 25 units of seniors social housing in the long term, and enhance the Hillsborough Rd entrance to the park.
- f) note that we have not yet received relevant documentation regarding the original decision to acquire the Liston Village site under Auckland City Council, and request that this be provided to the local board as soon as practicable.
- g) note the following further feedback in relation to the report presented to us, which we hope will be addressed in the report presented to the Mayor and Councillors for their decision-making on next steps:
 - the report should mention Auckland Council's commitment to being an Age-Friendly City, and the importance of seniors housing measures in that UNendorsed programme.
 - ii) the Puketapapa Open Space Network Plan, adopted by the Local Board in February 2019, did not identify a shortfall of open space in the Hillsborough East area, where Monte Cecilia Park is located, and identified that the open space priority in relation to Monte Cecilia Park was "development of a significant playground", not additional open space.
 - iii) the 2015 Liston Village Housing for the Elderly report identified Hillsborough as "highest demand area for social housing in Auckland."
 - iv) the reputational risk of Auckland Council demolishing seniors social housing to provide open space during a housing crisis and in an area identified as having a social housing shortfall but not an open space shortfall is not reflected in the report, nor is the significant community support for retaining Liston Village.
 - v) over the last nine years Monte Cecilia Park has had 36,600m2 of open space added to it already through purchases of Monte Cecilia School, the Moore property on Mt Albert Rd, residential housing areas on Hillsborough Rd and Korma Rd, and a map should be included with the report that shows this clearly.
 - vi) in regard to costs, those listed in the report are based on the 2018 LTP process and are likely to change significantly through the business case process. We hope it would also be point the opportunity to redevelop the site using the Haumaru approach currently being used for a 40 unit development underway in Henderson.
 - vii) the lack of Council provided seniors social housing on the Auckland isthmus, in contrast with the 62 villages (with one further development) offered throughout the rest of the Auckland region.



- viii) past concerns regarding sightlines to Pah Homestead from Hillsborough Rd are addressed by both Option 2 and Option 3.
- ix) option 4 is not well-developed in particular lacking any explanation of the temporary nature of any housing at the Korma Rd site, or the reputational risk to Council from re-building housing on a site that it demolished housing on in 2016.
- x) the need to ascertain a more up to date view from the Catholic Diocese as to how they might view a repurposing of some or all of the Liston Village land, in regard to assessment of the legal risk
- xi) the current Monte Cecilia Park Concept Plan, adopted in 2015 and explicitly superseding all previous plans for the park, is deliberately silent on the future of the Liston Village site and does not include it within the boundaries of the park. It allows for the development of the park within the current footprint and does not anticipate the need to add further open space to achieve the outcomes identified in the concept plan.

 - i) supplying enough infrastructure to support rapid urban growth
 - ii) adapting to climate change
 - iii) coping with the growth in tourism
 - iv) coping with the accumulation of responsibilities placed on local government by central government
- e) agree with pursuing the option of a "value capture" funding tool where property owners (inclusive of commercial property owners) enjoy windfall gains in their property values from such changes as introduction of:
 - i) planning changes,



- ii) light rail and the Central Rail Link
- iii) movement in the urban rural boundaries,
- iv) the removal of power pylons, etc.
- f) agree that a new funding stream, from central government to local government, should be developed to support essential new works.
- g) support a tax on vacant land. Noting that vacant land may not necessarily mean empty land.
- h) agree that the role of NZTA should be extended to critical local roads under threat from climate change.
- i) agree that where local services also benefit national interests, central government should contribute funding.
- j) agree with the recommendation to phase out the current rates rebate scheme and introduce a national rates postponement scheme as a way of making the current funding scheme more equitable and transparent
- k) agree that Special Purpose Vehicles (SPVs) could help councils nearing their debit limits and at times should be used to support high grown councils approaching their debt limits to continue to invest in development.
- agree with the recommendation that the Government create a climate-resilience agency and associated fund to help at-risk councils design, and possibly relocate and rebuild, wastewater, stormwater and flood-protection infrastructure threatened by impacts of climate change.
- m) agree that the Government should legislate to enable councils in tourist centres to implement an accommodation levy.
- n) agree that a cause of funding pressures on local government is the continued accumulation of tasks and responsibilities passed from central government, without adequate funding means.
- support creating a new three-waters regulatory regime to enforce minimum standards improve the performance of the three-water sector. Noting that the regime would be permissive and flexible about how councils meet these standards, but with a backstop arrangement applied to minimum health and environmental standards.

 - iii) this part of the proposal is well supported across local boards and would be able to proceed soon if split off from the equity issue which is more complex
 - iv) the CCO Review has identified further opportunities for local decisionmaking and accountability mechanisms that will impact on how CCOs interact with local boards in this sphere, and this ongoing work should be included in the Governance Framework Review.
- c) strongly supports the principle of local community service funding being based on equity rather than assets, noting:
 - i) the historic focus on linking funding to assets has unfairly advantaged areas who are already well served and disadvantaged those who are not



- ii) this is a more controversial area of the proposal and will prove more difficult to resolve, therefore we are comfortable with the equity issue being split off from the decision-making issue which is more straight forward
- iii) current asset data provided is not correct and must be able to be relied upon before equity calculations can be effectively made for comparison prior to giving further feedback.
- iv) local boards require more information, in particular in relation to the impact on other local boards, before we can progress this issue further.
- d) supports the principle of changing the funding model that would ensure that local boards not currently receiving equitable funding get additional funding, noting that:
 - i) we do not support the proposal for a 5 percent weighting for land values, as it is likely to further entrench historic disadvantage for areas with fewer assets which tend to also be those with lower land values
 - ii) we support a short timeframe for transition, to ensure re-balancing is able to happen as soon as practicable
 - iii) this part of the funding model is complex and requires further work before it can be progressed with more widespread buy-in.
- e) does not support the visitor services factor proposal and instead prefers a separate mechanism be developed to address this situation specific to Waiheke Local Board.
- f) supports in principle the proposal for minimum service levels.
- g) request an investigation into clear mechanisms to provide service levels about the minimum to address our concerns that the minimum could become a defacto upper limit if resourcing does not allow for anything above the minimum.
- h) notes concern regarding the minimum service level proposal specifically in regard to citizenship ceremonies, which are currently part funded by the Department of Internal Affairs, and requests further work be undertaken on this area.

 - C) Plans and policies are often too broad and lacking in specifics, and require considerable interpretation by CCOs to make them operational
 - D) Letters of expectation are too vague and fail to give CCOs adequate guidance in preparing their statements of intent
 - E) CCOs' interactions with local boards does not result in effective accountability. CCOs largely inform local boards about projects in their area rather than seek real input into their design. CCOs are also not sufficiently responsive to local boards' concerns and do not coordinate their efforts in local board areas with other CCOs
 - F) Council rewrites its Governance Manual for Substantive CCOs so the focus is squarely on its expectations of CCOs, removing policies to a



separate document and requiring incoming directors and senior managers to read the manual.

- iii) is concerned that the draft Statement of Expectations (SOE) is too high level and will not provide the requisite detail to CCOs of council's expectations on "how" CCOs must undertake their business. It is necessary that the adoption of an SOE leads to a meaningful understanding of expectations and a change in approach.
- iv) believes that the wording of the draft SOE, specifically to "build good relationships" and "consult" with local boards does not recognise them as governors but continues to treat them as one of many stakeholders.
- v) provides the following specific feedback:
 - A) Te Tāruke-ā-Tāwhiri (Auckland's Climate Plan) should be explicitly mentioned as it has been agreed at the political level that it should be the lens on all council work
 - B) CCOs should develop plans to support local board governance, for instance annual work programmes or community engagement plans. This should include prioritisation of the CCOs work programmes and delivery in each local board area.
 - C) endorse the focus on requiring CCO's to understand and give effect to Tāmaki Makaurau's shared governance model.
 - D) request the addition of a specific requirement for CCOs to take account of Local Board Plans when developing work programmes.
 - E) recommend including reference to the value of using common processes across the Council family, when appropriate, particularly as the public do not see CCOs and Council as separate from each other.
 - F) require clarity on the reporting back mechanism for progress against the SOE, including how local boards will be included in evaluating progress and receiving progress reports.

16 Seeking local board views on the Government Policy Statement on Housing and Urban Development discussion document

Resolution number PKTPP/2021/147

MOVED by Member B Shen, seconded by Member H Doig:

That the Puketāpapa Local Board:

- a) support the overall direction of the discussion document and notes it is broadly consistent with all of the outcomes in the Puketāpapa Local Board Plan:
 - i) Inclusive communities that are healthy, connected and thriving
 - ii) Our people speak up and help shape our future
 - iii) Our environment is protected and enhanced for present and future generations
 - iv) Well-planned neighbourhoods and vibrant public spaces
 - v) Transport options that are reliable, accessible and less polluting
 - vi) Thriving local economy with opportunities to learn, work and volunteer
- a) support the proposed vision of the GPS-HUD that 'Everyone in New Zealand lives in a healthy, secure and affordable home that meets their needs, within a thriving, inclusive and sustainable economy'.
- b) reiterate the importance of holistic wellbeing which means safe and healthy homes and infrastructure, and economic possibilities to help thriving communities, as mentioned in the GPS-HUD and the Puketāpapa Local Board Plan.
- c) support the proposed Thriving Communities Outcome, with these suggested amendments:



- i) note that the only way to achieve 'thriving communities' is to ensure there is sufficient community, transport and services infrastructure and facilities to support larger scale communities (as opposed to low density suburbia typical of areas earmarked for intense development in Puketāpapa)
- ii) note that local government needs to be supported, resourced and funded to undertake planning and parallel delivery of these community needs. This is because local government has the best understanding of unique communities' need, under the principle of subsidiarity
- iii) note that the discussion document states that "a one-size-fits-all solution for housing and urban development will not deliver the thriving communities we want". The local board strongly supports this statement but would argue that there is a strong basis for considering Tāmaki Makaurau / Auckland as a special case. This is due to its size, complexity, pace of growth, pace of demographic change, ethnic diversity and the fact that it has different local governance arrangements to the rest of Aotearoa / New Zealand.
- d) support the proposed Wellbeing through Housing Outcome, with these suggested amendments:
 - i) support equitable access to quality housing and genuine housing choice for all its citizens in neighbourhoods and communities that are walkable, well-planned and have access to community, as well as essential, infrastructure.
 - ii) currently, inequitable access to housing means that some of our most deprived residents are unable to remain in the neighbourhood that many generations of their whanau have lived in. Moves should be made specifically to prevent this outcome in ongoing and future development.
- e) support the proposed Partnering for Maori Housing and Urban Solutions Outcome.
- f) support the proposed An Adaptive and Responsive System Outcome, with these suggested amendments:
 - i) seek the addition of the concept of resiliency to this outcome in the context of a climate emergency and other natural disasters to echo Focus Area three
 - ii) seek the prioritisation of brownfield development and limiting greenfield development due to the ongoing costs (financial due to infrastructure and servicing costs, social, and environmental) as a result of urban sprawl
 - iii) note that greenfield development should be limited particularly in light of a climate emergency: to encourage low carbon lifestyles, decrease resilience issues due to isolation, and loss of productive soils as per the National Policy Statement Highly Productive Land.
 - iv) seek policy settings that include strong incentives for a 'green' approach to building (for example mandating the New Zealand Green Building Council ratings for all public buildings, and tax incentives or rates rebates for retrofitting to meet these standards, reducing embodied carbon and giving greater consideration to the life cycles of assets (both in terms of housing assets and infrastructure that supports them).
 - v) seek policy settings that ensure that tree protection and tree planting are both given serious consideration in the context of housing and urban development.
 - A) In the context of housing and urban development this is highly relevant as the inclusion of street trees in any urban planning can have a significant impact on the overall carbon emissions of our housing stock and essential infrastructure. It also improves amenity and contributes to a healthier population. Auckland Council, as a whole, and many local boards (including Puketāpapa) have created urban ngahere (forest) strategies. These can assist delivery of positive tree canopy outcomes in parallel with housing development.



- B) Seek provisions for trees that are professionally designed into housing development, which should, by process, be the right tree for the right place, to have protection after the housing is on sold. This retains the natural character of tree canopy cover in new or renewed neighbourhoods and allows the tree canopy to mature. As a baseline, to require a resource consent to remove the tree and require a replacement where reasonable.
- vi) note that greater protection for what little built heritage remains in our rohe has been consistently identified as a priority for our communities. The local board would support an approach that accelerates high-density urban development but also incentivises protection and restoration of heritage buildings where possible. Partnership with mana whenua is critical to ensuring that sites of historic significance to Māori are not only protected, but have their stories told and have the opportunity to receive Māori names and signage.
- vii) note the importance of the Manukau and Waitematā Harbours, and urban waterways such as Te Auaunga / Oakley Creek and Wairaki Stream, and the need to advocate for planning and development frameworks that support positive change for the health of our waterways.
- viii) note the importance of sequencing when large housing development is planned, examples from the Puketāpapa context being:
 - A) services infrastructure must be funded and delivered before or in tandem with housing development
 - B) planning and delivery of community infrastructure (such as network provisions for schools, medical care, meeting spaces, open space (parks and reserves) should occur in tandem with housing development, not afterwards or as an afterthought.
 - C) public transport infrastructure should be delivered before housing development to assist mode shift to low carbon transport modes servicing highly intensified environments
- g) support Focus Area one, 'Provide homes that meet people's needs', with these suggested amendments:
 - i) note that it is one of the most diverse areas of Tāmaki Makaurau / Auckland. It has particularly high Asian populations and the local board is proud to support and empower all its diverse communities. To that end, the local board supports the directions set out in the discussion around provision of housing to support diverse family structures. That must include provision of culturally appropriate housing to support large families, and intergenerational living, and the provision of communal areas in apartment blocks that cater for wider whanau gatherings.
 - ii) support the principle of locals being able to stay locally long term and not be displaced. There is a risk that housing (including social housing) being driven by the market is currently delivering a very narrow band of the community need and this leads to displacement of local family units. There are many examples in Kāinga Ora's Mt Roskill South Development where the 'right to return' policy is not effective as family units have outgrown housing typologies that are being built.
 - iii) seek that there be Universal Access / accessibility in housing, at least for a guaranteed portion of housing developments
 - iv) support the focus on child and youth wellbeing but would be interested to understand what emphasis will be placed on housing for the elderly and disabled, who are also vulnerable and currently disadvantaged by lack of appropriate housing



- v) encourage 'active edges' to urban developments where appropriate, eg along transport corridors, toward open space, encouraging activation, or mixed-use opportunities.
 - A) 'Active edges' can be defined as "street frontages where there is an active visual engagement between those in the street and those on the ground and upper floors of buildings. Active frontages can provide informal surveillance opportunities and often improve the vitality and safety of an area".
 - B) The Auckland Design Manual also mentions "Well-designed perimeter developments are desirable in that they have a strong presence, effectively framing the street, and providing visual interest and activity which enhances street character" and "street-activating uses along street edges... mixed use developments contribute to creating lively street environments when they have active uses at the ground level."
- vi) encourage more support for mixed-use zoning and development which can enable people to walk to local shops and increase activation on the street level around housing increasing passive surveillance.
- h) support Focus Area two, 'Ensure that more affordable houses being built', with these suggested amendments:
 - i) notes that housing is more affordable when people live, work and play more locally
- i) support Focus Area three, 'Support resilient, sustainable, inclusive and prosperous communities', with these suggested amendments:
 - i) note that Tāmaki Makaurau / Auckland's population growth has consistently exceeded projections and this, alongside the need to reduce carbon emissions, means that there needs to be a much stronger focus on compact urban form and intensive brownfields development.
 - ii) support Te Tāruke-ā-Tāwhiri: Auckland's Climate Plan, which sets a goal of 64 per cent reduction in emissions from the transport sector by 2030 against a base year of 2016. The board urges central government to adopt similar targets in implementing the GPS-HUD. The local board has adopted its own low carbon plan ("Puketāpapa becoming a Low Carbon Community: An Action Plan")
 - iii) note that there need to be safe places to play so the relevant open spaces need to be provided (United Nations Article 31)
 - iv) note that quality of residential environment is important currently there are very little controls, encouragement or incentive for doing good quality development (by best practice urban design standards). Auckland Design Office has some guides and an urban review panel but are non-statutory.
- j) support Focus Area four, 'Invest in Maori-driven housing and urban solutions'
- k) support Focus Area five, 'Prevent and reduce homelessness', with these suggested amendments:
 - acknowledge the sensitivities around the homeless community where some choose to remain homeless (for example, to remain a part of a community) or because becoming homeless was not of their choosing due to aggravating circumstances, and the different housing arrangements this may require.
- l) supports Focus Area six, 'Re-establish housing's primary role as a home rather than a financial asset', with these suggested amendments:
 - i) seek reference to types of housing that may be required for segments of the community that may not be delivered under a commercially-driven property development model.
 - ii) note that the government's current mode of development is currently prioritised by volume over typologies that suit specific communities' needs particularly in brownfield development where communities already exist.



- iii) note that local government can play in the role of understanding what the community need is.
- iv) support exploring alternative ways to owning one's home that may be more accessible to some people such as rent-to-own schemes provided by central government
- m) support the Four 'Ways of Working', with these suggested amendments:
 - i) note its commitments to Māori under Te Tiriti o Waitangi (the Treaty of Waitangi) and supports the directions set out in the discussion around partnership with Māori and developing appropriate solutions to Māori housing needs that respects the desire of many Māori people to maintain an enduring relationship with their whenua.
 - ii) seek a much stronger emphasis on collaboration with local government, particularly at the local level (i.e. with local boards, in the Auckland Council context), on top of the document's acknowledgement of a need for collaboration.
 - A) note that collaboration is particularly critical around the development of new infrastructure, community facilities and wrap-around community provisions, and arrangements (including funding) for its ongoing stewardship and maintenance.
 - B) note concern about the role of local government, particularly in Tāmaki Makaurau / Auckland, in relation to housing and urban development. The discussion document refers to the GPS-HUD giving 'visibility' to all partners, but the local board is concerned as to whether central government will provide sufficient certainty to local government to enable it to undertake local planning (particularly spatial planning and infrastructure provision) with confidence.
 - C) note that the significant changes currently being proposed by central government around housing and urban development, water and infrastructure provision, and the role of local government itself. The local board is concerned to ensure that any changes to the local government do not cause unnecessary confusion or disruption to communities and that local government will retain its mandate to implement 'the four well-beings' and to provide certainty and continuity to communities in its provision of local services, assets, planning and governance. This is particularly relevant in Tāmaki Makaurau / Auckland.
 - iii) supports the whole-of-system approach adopted by the present government to address the inter-related issues of housing, urban development and infrastructure. While the local board acknowledges that it is necessary to look at local (and regional) governance as part of this, it notes that local government entities in particular Auckland Council have been attempting to prioritise intensive housing development for some years but has struggled to meet demand due to a range of factors, largely beyond their control.

 - i) the importance of waste minimisation for the sustainability of Tāmaki Makaurau and the environmental wellbeing of the city.
 - ii) the importance of progressing waste minimisation through multiple solutions (levers) as an integrated approach that considers equity across different communities.

Kerbside refuse collection model options

- request that kerbside collection options come as integrated packages, such as smaller landfill waste bins being rolled out alongside the food scrap service, providing the opportunity to decrease landfill waste volumes.
- c) support encouraging the use of three sizes of bins where the amount of rates for waste services is proportional to bin size as an incentive to use a smaller bin.
- d) request that the options presented consider both low and high density housing models and explore mechanisms that can future-proof development to utilise council waste services (landfill, recycling, and food scraps), and support updating relevant bylaws to require multi-unit apartment waste management and minimisation plans to reflect new policy standards.
- e) support the priority of retaining as many people as possible on the council's waste collection service, bringing the community along on Auckland's Journey to Zero Waste as detailed in the Waste Management and Minimisation Plan and other council plans and strategies around waste.
- f) request investigation into the merits of providing separate collection for cardboard and paper, noting concerns around contamination leading to an increase in material heading to landfill.
- g) note the health and safety of rubbish collectors should be a priority and should be considered for all options and exceptions.
- h) note the inconclusive results of studies into whether Pay as You Throw (PAYT) correlates to amount of waste generated.
- i) note concerns around the number of bins on limited street space and the effect of bins on street use and amenity.

Education and communications:

- j) request that once the decision has been made, education is prioritised and communications to the public reflect this multi-solution approach, with the following recommendation:
 - i) local environmental groups and low carbon networks, particularly those dealing with waste, will be a key mechanism to deliver the messages and education.
- k) request that provisions are made to work with Kāinga Ora to encourage waste minimisation with their tenants since a rates-funded model decouples the tenant from the waste charge and bin size.

Feedback on Puketāpapa Local Board area:

- I) support retaining a rates-funded system due to the evidence-based officer advice as presented in the report.
- m) note that Puketāpapa has a lower home ownership rate than Auckland regionally and that under a PAYT system, tenants would have to bear the cost directly in addition to their rent cost.
- n) request special consideration is given to how tenants can be a part of the waste minimisation kaupapa especially in a rates-funded model where they are not directly paying for the amounts associated with bin size.
- o) request further investigation be done to understand the impact of the proposed options on larger households, noting that the average household size of Puketāpapa is larger than the Auckland regional average household size.

 - 2) from publicly-owned land used exclusively golfers to sport and recreation for all Aucklanders
 - 3) from asset-based investment in traditional mid-level (development) golf courses to a broad golf service offering across the network that appeal to a wider group of people
 - 4) from variable environmental management of publicly-owned golf land to best practice in ecosystem management and biodiversity conservation that meets clearly defined targets

- a) express concern over the resource consent applications for multi-unit residential developments, particularly townhouses, that do not appear to consider the effects of multiple bins on the kerbside.
- b) note that local examples (some attached in context below) have been built in the Puketāpapa Local Board area that are causing negative impacts to the use of streets for all community members, highlighting the urgent need for work in this area.
- c) note that an excessive number of bins in the public realm on rubbish collection days can have an adverse effect by:
 - i) crowding on limited kerbside space
 - ii) blocking the footpath creating accessibility issues including obstructing children from walking, riding and scooting safely to school
 - iii) making it difficult for rubbish trucks to access bins creating inefficiencies and causing a protracted hazard on the road
 - iv) clash with driveways and parked cars
 - v) amplifying undesirable effects such as odours and unkept bins
 - vi) creating multiple hazards for road users, especially in extreme weather events or when bins fall over
- d) note that with the townhouse/terrace house typology being increasingly popular under the Auckland Unitary Plan provisions and more units per site being developed, a swift response to protect our public realm and create better waste outcomes should be established urgently.
- e) note that to achieve the 'quality compact' city outlined in the Auckland Plan, increasing brownfield development in existing neighbourhoods means this issue must be addressed sooner rather than later as they have long-term impacts on the neighbourhood level.
- f) acknowledge that work is being done by the Waste Solutions team looking at different typologies and their suitability for kerbside and Auckland Council non-standard waste services for denser development
- g) endorse the waste minimisation and landfill diversion kaupapa of the Waste Management and Minimisation Plan (WMMP) 2018 with multiple bin types, as captured in our feedback resolution PKTPP/2021/198 (attached).
- h) note that the upcoming changes to waste services, pending decisions from the Governing Body, which will likely result in three types of bins per household including the foodscrap service will amplify the issues on the kerbside.
- i) request the Environment and Climate Change Committee and Planning Committee work collaboratively to create provisions in the Auckland Unitary Plan and upcoming waste services to ensure Tāmaki Makaurau's streetscape and footpaths are accessible and enjoyable to use.



- j) recommend that a threshold be determined where if a number of units (or some other trigger) for multi-unit residential development is exceeded, there is a requirement for a multi-unit residential waste service that is catered for onsite with bin provisions to enable the use of Auckland Council's non-standard service so that the use of the kerbside is not required, which can be checked during the resource consent stage or other process for all development
- k) note that the Medium Density Residential Standards from Central Government can in some cases bypass the resource consent process and the scrutiny of the waste services team at council so provisions must be made clear and required in planning provisions
- I) request that provisions be set out where Auckland Council can provide nonstandard service to multi-unit residential so that:
 - i) developments are a part of the waste reduction kaupapa under the WMMP, as the waste programmes evolve
 - ii) a baseline service can be provided by Auckland Council if a private provider is not providing waste collection services, noting that these provisions should by default allow for the collection of different waste streams
 - iii) developers and designers can be certain of what is required to enable good practice waste management practices such as landfill diversion
- m) note Auckland Council's role as custodians of the public realm to ensure equitable and accessible use of the road corridor
- n) request that this Notice of Motion is sent to the Environment and Climate Change Committee and the Planning Committee for action
