Jared passed this to me so I could provide some context to this discussion.

The Out-of-Hours Music Programme (OOHM) was removed from the Staffing Orders in Council in August 2005 but has continued to operate since that time anyway. It is probably for this reason that there is no budget and also no specific person accountable for the programme as it effectively does not exist.

GL code 11240 pays for all staff considered to be part of the delivery of the programme which includes Tutors, Coordinators (teaching and non-teaching) and Liaison Assistants (I have never heard of Facilitators). The programme is supposed to be run outside of school hours, preferably Saturday mornings, and cannot be charged for as it was designed to allow children from areas/schools who did not have the money to be able to learn and instrument for free.

The rates that were set in November 2005 remain unchanged and this is all that is funded by the Ministry. the rates are not negotiated as this programme is not part of the sector (currently). If schools choose to pay more than these rates then they become accountable for the additional cost, not the Ministry.

Thanks for this. I think you are on the right track Edward. The draft service guide (included below) says something similar. But the bit I've highlighted implies the ministry pays doesn't it?

I've spoken to my manager <sup>9(2)(a)</sup> and we are both of the assumption that resourcing used additional funding paid through the operational grant at the agreed rates below. The school can then pay the staff what they like per hour and find the funding for the difference from other sources, including fees charged to users. Another possibility is maybe what you pay schools currently covers wages AND admin. Also we don't have the access to track an RC unfortunately.

Any tips on who else to chat to Jared are much appreciated.

# Payment of Supervisors, Tutors and Other Staff

## **Tutors**

• A tutor is a person employed by the Board of Trustees of a state or integrated school to instruct a class or course.

#### Co-ordinators

There are two co-ordinator positions; Teaching and Non-teaching co-ordinator. A teaching co-ordinator is a co-ordinator who is employed concurrently as a tutor under the terms of the applicable contract or subsequent agreement. A non-teaching co-ordinator is a co-ordinator who is not also employed as a tutor.

For teachers: pro rata on salary

#### **Facilitators**

A person employed to assist the co-ordinator and who also mentors the tutors. These duties include the
assessment, coaching and providing of guidance to tutors.

# Payment of Housekeeping Costs to Host Schools (Admin Costs)

- This covers cost for heating, cleaning, caretaking and clerical support associated with out-of-hours. This is generally calculated as 25% of the total number of tutor hours that have been allocated.
- The hourly administration grant rate is \$10.92 (incl. GST) in 2021.

Mōrena e hoa ma,

I'll start with eating a slice or two of humble pie. I undertook some research and had a chat with a couple of people last week in my effort to come up with a simple solution for OOHMA rate increases given that I was under the impression it operated as a contributory model like ORS TAs. Until we met yesterday I was not aware that the "tutors, Coordinators (teaching and non-teaching) and Liaison Assistants/facilitators" were largely paid from a Ministry funded payroll bucket 11240 (extract from 9(2)(a) email of 11 Jan 2022 that Angus circulated yesterday). Sorry

However, what it means from an implementation perspective is that EDK/Ken won't have to calculate a top-up for schools that pay staff from the 11240 code as the Ministry is already meeting the cost of the salaries – when rates are adjusted we'll still meet the cost. This might also apply to any backpay – it will be funded directly from that code. It is the OOHMA staff that are funded from school's bulk grant salary code (11010) that EDK/Ken will have to calculate and deliver a "top-up" for.

I am going to dig a little deeper into the hours used. As there has been no monitoring of OOHMA hours allocated vs OOHMA hours used for many years the hours have crept up —they certainly had in 2021. While there's probably nothing we can do about this now, I'm interested in those schools who may be sticking to their hours against 11240, and charging additional to 11010 (their own BG), vs those who may be using more hours than they have been allocated, but charge all the salaries to 11240.
