Dear Ms Morse

I refer to your email of 13 September 2015 in which you request:

A copy of the Director's speech & powerpoint presentation that was to be delivered on September 11 at National Library – all pre- and post-meeting communications between the GCSB and the Privacy Commissioner that relate to this event.

My speaking notes for my speech to the Technology and Privacy Forum that was to be delivered on Friday 11 September 2015, but was instead delivered on Tuesday 29 September 2015 are currently available at www.gcsb.govt.nz/news/news/. Therefore, I decline to provide you with this information under section 18(d) of the Official Information Act 1982 (*the Act*) on the grounds that it is already publicly available.

I decline to provide you with the powerpoint presentation to which you refer under section 18(e) of the Act because no such document exists.


I have enclosed copies of the communications between the GCSB and the Office of the Privacy Commissioner that are within the scope of your request. You will see that the communications are between the Department of the Prime Minister and Cabinet (DPMC) and the Office of the Privacy Commissioner. This is because the communications function for the GCSB is managed by the National Security Communications team based in DPMC.

Redactions to this correspondence are made under section 9(2)(a) of the Act on the grounds that withholding this information is necessary to protect the privacy of natural persons. This justification for withholding the redacted information is not outweighed by other public interest consideration.

An attachment to one email has not been included because the speech notes are now available on our website, as noted above.

In accordance with section 19 of the Act, you have the right to seek an investigation and review of the refusal outlined above by way of complaint to an Ombudsmen under section 28(3) of the Act.
