Consent to export:

A permit to export hazardous waste is hereby granted to the permit holder under clause 11 of the Imports and Exports (Restrictions) Prohibition Order (No 2) 2004, based on the information set out in the permit application and the declaration provided to the Environmental Protection Authority (EPA) by the permit holder on 24/01/2018, and the additional information provided to the EPA by the permit holder, and in accordance with any conditions on consent set by India, and the conditions set out below.

Conditions:

1. The permit holder must submit movement/tracking documents to the Environmental Protection Authority (EPA) **prior to or within 10 working days of shipment of the hazardous waste.**
2. The permit holder must submit the **completed** movement/tracking documents to the Environmental Protection Authority (EPA) **within 10 working days of receiving it from the facility undertaking disposal, treatment or other processing of the hazardous waste.**
3. The hazardous waste must be packaged, labelled, and transported in conformity with generally accepted and recognised international rules and standards in the field of packaging, labelling and transport, and due account must be taken of relevant international recognised practices.
4. If the hazardous waste cannot be processed in the manner set out in the permit application, or if the movement of the hazardous waste is or becomes illegal, the permit holder must:
 - a. notify the EPA as soon as possible and not later than 2 working days of becoming aware of the situation;
and
 - b. if directed by the EPA, and at the permit holder's expense,:
 - i. arrange for alternative disposal of the hazardous waste in a manner satisfactory to the EPA within 45 days (for waste that cannot be processed in the manner described in the permit application), or 15 days (if the movement of waste is or becomes illegal); or
 - ii. arrange for the immediate return of the hazardous waste to the exporter and assist with its return to New Zealand.
 - c. meet the cost of any resulting environmental harm caused by the hazardous waste.
5. The permit holder must obtain insurance coverage for movement of the hazardous waste which provides cover on terms no less favourable than those set out in the draft insurance policy submitted to the EPA on 22/02/2018 and must submit a copy of the insurance certificate and policy to the EPA prior to shipment of the hazardous waste.
