The Prime Minister has confirmed that the whole of New Zealand will move to the red traffic light setting at 11.59pm on Sunday, 23 January 2022.

Lincoln University follows [the Ministry of Education's \(MoE\) guidelines for Tertiary Education Organisations on operating under the COVID-19 Protection Framework \(CPF\)](#). Under the red setting, the University is mandated by Government requirements. We expect the MoE's guidelines will continue to be updated over the coming weeks and as more detailed information is made available, we will share it as soon as practicable.

Under the red setting, the following COVID-19 measures are effective on campus

- Campus is open at the red setting for staff and students who hold a My Vaccine Pass, or a valid MoH exemption
- Masks are mandatory indoors at all times while on campus
- All physical distancing and scanning of QR codes requirements, including practising good hygiene, continue
- Staff are encouraged to work from home if they can do so – this should be confirmed with your line manager.

Teaching and learning

- Summer School continues in-person for students and staff who hold a My Vaccine Pass, or a valid MoH exemption
- All course material must be made available online via Akoraka|Learn for students who are unable to attend in person
- Akoraka|Learn remains the main place for all course information
- Any course updates or changes will be communicated via Akoraka|Learn
- Students are encouraged to check Akoraka|Learn for details and changes on individual courses
- Students should contact their course examiners if they have any questions or require more information
- The Library will require all people to show their My Vaccine Pass to enter.

How your My Vaccine Pass will be verified from Monday, 24 January 2022

- Your vaccine pass will be verified by the University when you come onto campus from Monday morning, 24 January 2022
- All staff and students coming onto campus must first report through to Grounded (George Forbes Building) to have their My Vaccine Passes scanned from 8.00am onwards
- All buildings will be locked down to ID card access only for 48 hours to manage onsite verification.

If you are unwell, waiting for your COVID-19 test results or have been asked to self-isolate you must stay home and not come onto campus.

Research at red

Research students and their supervisors should work together to assess how to progress research safely and in line with the red setting. Any off-campus research activity involving other people must meet the University's requirements and meet the requirements of the host organisation/premises.

Facilities and visitors at red

All activities and events on campus must comply with relevant health and safety laws, and are expected to undertake risk assessments and consider additional public health measures as appropriate. Te Kete Ika, Mrs O's, Whare Hakinakina LU Gym, The Bookshop and the Canon Print Shop will continue to use the Government-issued Verifier App to verify Vaccine Passes to gain entry.
