Memorandum of Understanding **between** the New Zealand Police **and** the Police Complaints Authority.

Purpose

1. This Memorandum of Understanding (Memorandum) defines the working relationship between the Commissioner of the New Zealand Police ("the Commissioner") and the Police Complaints Authority ("the Authority") in relation to incidents of serious misconduct or serious neglect of duty that are internally reported within the Police.

Definitions

- 2. Serious Misconduct and Serious Neglect of Duty
- (a) Misconduct or neglect of duty shall be deemed to be serious for the purpose of this Memorandum if such misconduct or neglect of duty constitutes a criminal offence, or is of such significant public interest as to put at risk the reputation of the New Zealand Police.
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- (c) For further avoidance of doubt the offences of misconduct or neglect of duty listed in the Second Schedule to this Memorandum, taken from Reg.9 of the Police Regulations 1992, shall be reportable to the PCA and subject to the provisions of paragraph 4 of this memorandum.

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The expression internally reported is used in this Memorandum to refer to the bringing to official Police notice any serious misconduct or serious neglect of duty by means of a Police member reporting the fact to a senior Police member, rather than by means of a complaint made by a member of the public or by a Police member acting in his or her private capacity.

First Schedule

Offences of misconduct and neglect of duty

Police Regulations 1992

Reg 9 Disciplinary offences by sworn members of Police The following shall be offences of misconduct or neglect of duty on the part of any sworn member for the purposes of the Act:

- (1) Disobedience of the lawful order of a supervisor:
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- (3) Insubordinate conduct by word or act:
- (4) Oppressive conduct towards a subordinate:
- (6) Being absent from his or her sub-district when on duty, except in the course of duty or with permission:
- (7) Consuming intoxicating liquor while on duty in uniform:
- (8) Drunkenness or intoxication by alcohol, drugs, or any substance while on duty:
- (9) Bringing into or keeping in offices any intoxicating liquor, except in the course of duty or with the permission of the Assistant Commissioner or District Manager:
- (10) Using insulting or offensive language in any report or any other official document:
- (11) Using indecent, insulting, abusive, or threatening language in or upon Police premises or while on duty:
- (13) Refusing or failing without reasonable cause to pay any lawful debt or becoming a bankrupt:
- (16) Without reasonable excuse, sleeping or lying down on any beat or place when on duty:
- (17) Without reasonable excuse, failing to work any beat or patrol in accordance with defined directions:
- (18) Without reasonable excuse, leaving or being absent from any beat, post or place of duty:
- (19) Without reasonable excuse, being absent from or late for parade, Court, or other duty:
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- (21) Unduly holding over any complaint:
- (22) Failing to take due and prompt measures for the investigation of any matter requiring to be investigated or for the arrest of any offender:
- (23) Failing to report promptly accidents, offences, or unusual occurrences:
- (24) Failing to report promptly anything which the member knows concerning an offence or offender, or to disclose any evidence which the member or any other person can give for or against any defendant:
- (27) Without reasonable excuse, divulging any information which it is the member's duty not to divulge:

- (28) Knowingly making any false return, report, or statement or signing any false certificate:
- (29) Wilfully making any false entry in any official document, record, or information recorded or stored by means of any tape recorder, computer, or other device:
- (30) Wilfully or negligently omitting to make an entry in any official book, document, record, or information recorded or stored by means of any tape recorder, computer, or other device as to any matter which ought to be entered:
- (31) Without colour of right:
- (a) Destroying, mutilating, or removing from the place where it is normally kept an official book or document, or any record or information recorded or stored by means of any tape recorder, computer, or other device; or
- (b) Altering or erasing any entry made in any such book, document, record, or information:
- (32) Suppressing, destroying, or damaging any official correspondence, report, or other document, or unduly holding over or concealing the same:
- (33) Failing to make a true, accurate, and prompt return of all money received for which account is required, or unduly holding over or improperly using any money or property belonging to any person or the Government:
- (34) Wilfully or negligently losing or damaging in the course of duty any Government property, any property in that member's custody, or any property is the custody of any other member:
- (35) Using a departmental motor vehicle without proper authority or outside the scope of the authority given:
- (36) Prevarication before any Court or inquiry:
- (37) While on duty, wearing any party emblem, taking part or marching in any party procession, or otherwise manifesting political or sectarian partisanship:
- (38) While in uniform, wearing any medal or badge whatever without the authority of the Commissioner:
- (40) Negligence in the discharge of the member's duties:
- (41) Wilfully violating any provision of these regulations, or of general instructions, or of any general order issued by the Commissioner, the member's Assistant Commissioner, the member's District Manager, or the Director: Training of the Royal New Zealand Police College:
- (42) Any act, conduct, disorder, or neglect to the prejudice of good order, morality, or discipline of the Police, though not specified in these regulations.

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- (15) Improperly using for private advantage his or her position as a member of the Police;

- (25) Directly or indirectly giving or causing notice to be given to any person, with a view to the evasion of a summons, warrant, or other process, or in any way conniving at, assisting, or encouraging any person to evade the same;
- (26) Wilfully or negligently allowing any prisoner to escape;
