Thank you for your Official Information Act request received on 5 June 2018:

"I understand that you require recruitment candidates to for advisory roles to complete written exercises. Please provide a copy of all question papers used in 2017."

The State Services Commission does not have a requirement that candidates complete written exercises as part of the recruitment process. Your request is therefore declined under section 18(e) the Official Information Act as the information you requested does not exist.

Individual managers do have the discretion to include a written exercise in their recruitment processes on case-by-case basis. Copies of such ad hoc written exercises are not required to be retained. Any relevant analysis of written exercises is captured in individual write-ups on each applicant.
