Establishing a Health and Disability System Review (Health) SWC-18-SUB-0052	No	<p>Issue – the Review brings together issues and themes from various reviews already underway and the Ministerial Advisory Group. The Minister of Health intends that the Review will identify and build public consensus for any significant system and institutional change.</p> <p>The disability system is out of scope in relation to the Review until the Enabling Good Lives prototype is rolled out and the review into funded family care is undertaken.</p> <p>Opportunity – the review presents an opportunity to have issues for Māori health considered in terms of the system as a whole. For example primary care, which will be a key focus of the review, is critical to improving Māori outcomes.</p>	<p>1. It is recommended that you agree with the recommendations in the paper</p> <p>2. And consider raising:</p> <p>a. The importance of Māori being represented in the Review team and in the Review's terms of reference given that the 2013 Disability Survey identified one in four Māori as disabled.</p>

Establishing the New Zealand and Disability System Review/ Hauora Manaaki Ki Aotearoa Whānui (CBC-18-SUB-0075)	Yes	Yes	<p>Issue - The Health and Disability System Review (the Review) aims to identify opportunities to improve the performance, structure, and sustainability of the system.</p> <p>Review goals include achieving equity of outcomes across the population, particularly for Māori and Pacific peoples. Te Puni Kōkiri has had an ongoing involvement with officials on the establishment and design of the Review.</p> <p>Review Terms of Reference have also been revised. Two key changes are of direct relevance to Māori:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> the inclusion of a more explicit recognition of the importance of Māori health issues the centrality of workforce issues (including cultural competence). <p>Opportunity – There is an opportunity to further enhance the Review's effectiveness through the appointment process for members of the Expert Review Panel.</p> <p>Te Puni Kōkiri can provide you with recommendations for nominees in anticipation of the Minister for Health consulting with you on his proposed appointees later in July.</p> <p>There is a further opportunity to ensure Review recommendations are relevant to Māori through the Review's proposed use of Reference and Advisory Groups in key service and stakeholder areas.</p>	<p>1. It is recommended that you agree with the recommendations in the paper</p> <p>2. And consider raising:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> The importance of ensuring appropriate Māori representation on the Review Panel; and The importance of engaging with key Māori stakeholders and groups on the reference and advisory groups, noting that Te Puni Kōkiri is able to co-design a Māori engagement strategy with the Ministry of Health if required.
