I refer to your Official Information Act request of 05 February for information relating to red light running policies.

You requested:

- 1. It is a bit unclear what defines an incident when a red light is said to be "run" in colloquial terminology. Is there a definition that Police use to define this when enforcing traffic signals?.....I would like clarity on what the Police's official policy on this is (i.e. what they use to enforce traffic signal infringements).*
